## HELENA BASKET TOSSERS AHEAD

Take Spirited 26 to 25 Game From Custer County High School Quintet.

Helena, March 28.—After playing a tie score for four minutes, Helena breezed out ahead of the Custer County high school basketball team here tonight by a score of 26 to 25, giving each one game toward the state interscholastic championship.  
Smith for Helena, and Bratsburg for Custer, furnished the spectacular plays, both making some splendid clean cut baskets from the center of the floor.  
The game opened with both teams playing a strong defensive game and neither side scored for seven minutes. Helena scored first. Custer got the lead and Helena climbed up, finally breaking a 22 all tie. Smith broke the tie with a clever basket from a toss up. The roughness of the first game was lacking and straight basketball, with plenty of splendid team work gave the fans a run for their money. The game was well attended.

## DARK HORSE WINS HANDBALL EVENTS

Helena, March 28.—Lester Loble, county attorney of Lewis and Clark, is the champion handball player of Montana, winning the title today from Kir-games straight both by a score of 21 to 19. When the series began no one believed that Loble stood a chance for the championship but he showed remarkable skill under competition.  
Earlier in the afternoon Hoon defeated in the semi-finals James Byrnes of Great Falls, formerly champion handball player of Ireland. Hoon took two games, the first by a score of 21 to 11 and the second 21 to 18.  
Byrnes was considered to have the edge on the championship but while playing Thursday afternoon in the first game was struck on the nose by a ball and suffered a hemorrhage that required the services of a physician. He stuck thru two games and then was willing to allow the final game to go to Hoon by default, but the Helena man would not take it, and insisted that the series be played over.

## SHE CLAIMS WOOD DIDN'T KEEP WORD

Wife Sues to Recover Rights in Property Which She Deeded to Husband.

According to a complaint filed in district court yesterday by Carrie J. Wood, her husband Charles P. Wood once deserted her, but that on January 20, 1919, he told her he would return and support her, allow her \$25 per month for the support of her mother, fix up the house, build an addition to it and construct a porch, put in a furnace and otherwise improve the place and help pay off a mortgage of \$1000 if she would convey to him a half interest in the property. She took him at his word, she states and deeded him the half interest, but declares that he then refused to observe his part of the agreement.  
He gave her \$25 for her mother, she admits, but she says he again deserted and abandoned her, refused to build the addition or construct a porch or put in a furnace, or do anything else he agreed to do. She thinks his representations were false, and made for the purpose of deceiving, misleading, cheating and defrauding her, and she wants the conveyance annulled and her husband permanently enjoined from asserting his claim. M. C. Grinde is also named defendant in the action, but Mrs. Wood asserts his claim against the property is void.
