LIFE INSURANCE AND ITS VALUES

Business and Professional Women's Club Hears Address by Local Man.

Members of the Business and Professional Women's club of the Y. W. C. A. heard a discussion of the subject of life insurance at their meeting last week...

"Why carry life insurance? At the outset I am going to say any individual with an earning capacity who is eligible to life insurance does not carry it not just to himself, his dependents nor his friends...

"Just before the influenza epidemic became rampant I wrote a man for a small policy. He fell hard and when he thought the dotted line he said, 'You are the first insurance man I ever permitted to talk to me and were it not for my little girl there (8 months old and sitting on her mother's lap) you would never write me for a dollar.'

"If a woman desires life insurance for protection of dependents and for the least possible investment of money, the non-participating 20-pay life policy is desirable. If she desires investment combined with protection she can secure a 20-pay life policy with these features combined...

Some of these are 'double indemnity for accidental deaths' and monthly indemnity for partial disability from sickness or accident.

"The 20-year endowment policy is a very popular policy for women. It differs from the 20-payment life in that at the end of the 20-year period the insured may receive in cash the face of the policy or accept a paid-up policy of its equivalent to be paid to the beneficiary at death.

"The ordinary, or whole-life policy, is very popular with men, as it affords a greater amount of protection for the premium deposit. This policy is ordinarily not placed upon the lives of women."
