Steel corporation was a disappointment to some and some pressure developed in this stock, but offerings were well absorbed and the trend of prices was upward. The general market showed considerable firmness. It is expected that during the current week something will develop abroad that will clarify things in many ways and in this assumption the conservative element is inclined to buy stocks during easy periods.

NEW YORK MARKET

FINANCIAL. New York, March 31.—The reported deadlock in Paris, which expressed itself in further demoralization of French exchange and heaviness of foreign war flotations, imposed additional restraints on the stock market today, tho, at its worst the undercurrent was uncertain.

Strength was most conspicuous in issues recently under greatest pressure, such as loans and other active utilities, including telegraphs and telephone shares.

United States Steel re-acted a point soon after the opening, but full or partial rallies set in later, the market strengthening on an extensive demand for leathers and shippings. Sales amounted to 750,000 shares.

The easier tone of international, fractional re-actions in minor domestic markets, steadiness of Liberty issues and strength of utilities measured the irregularity of the bond market. Sales (par value) aggregated \$13,250,000. Old United States bonds were unaltered or call.

CHICAGO MARKET

GRAIN AND PROVISIONS. Chicago, March 31.—A spectacular jump of 17 1/2 cents in the March delivery of corn resulted, today, from belated covering by a few shorts.

Other months kept within normal limits. The finish was unsettled 1 1/2 to 5 1/2 cents net higher, with May \$1.61 @ 1.61 1/2 and July 1.39 @ 1.39 1/2.

Aside from the momentary flash which accompanied month-end settlement of March contracts, interest in corn centered chiefly on prospects of material decrease of acreage, as indicated by almost entire absence of winter wheat abandonment.

It was pointed out that, in addition to the corn land which has already gone into wheat, much other corn ground must be subtracted, inasmuch as abandoned winter wheat acreage usually has been diverted in great degree to corn.
