**MILLER GOES UP FOR SEVEN YEARS**

Baxter and Miller's Son Each Get 18 Months for Stealing Automobiles in Canada.

Edward Miller, leader of the Miller gang of automobile thieves, will serve seven years for his crimes, his son L. R. Miller and his partner George Baxter will each serve 18 months in the penitentiary in Alberta for stealing automobiles. That is the information received yesterday by Sheriff James F. Burns, who rounded up the gang in this city and furnished the clues which got the other members at other points. One member, A. H. Carnahan, is being held here for trial on charge of stealing the Aker brothers' car in this city.

**Jury Fails to Fix Responsibility for Ruby Pascoe's Death**

Butte, June 27.—After two days taking testimony in the matter of the death of Ruby Pascoe, the coroner's jury this afternoon reported an open verdict which states that the girl met death from hemorrhage caused by fracture of the skull while riding in an automobile with Lewis Kellar. How and where the injury was received the jury was unable to determine. Ruby Pascoe is alleged to have met her death by leaping from the automobile in which she was riding on the flats south of Butte with Lewis Kellar, a member of the high school faculty of Butte, on the night of June 21. It is claimed by Kellar that the girl expressed a desire to go to one of the roadhouses when he proposed driving to Lake Avoca.

Kellar was not present at the inquest today, one of his attorneys stating his client was running away because of fear of being assassinated. County Attorney Jackson has a charge of murder filed against Kellar and the county prosecutor says he will proceed with the case, after studying the evidence.

**Wanted in Canada Is Found Working on Shelby Ranch**

Shelby, June 27.—A man giving his name as Kline, alias Granger, was arrested on Thursday by Deputy Sheriff Martin on instructions from the Canadian authorities for breaking jail. The charges laid against him include stealing horses, robbing the Dominion Express company, Kilkenny, Alta., and stealing a Ford car. The man had been working for J. A. Johnson at the river ranch last spring, and his wife and family came over the line with a wagon and team to find him. The woman was being watched by the Canadian authorities, and thus led to Kline's whereabouts. He was taken into custody by Constable Forstner of the provincial police, and taken back to Canada for trial yesterday.

**Planning Campaign to Raise Fund in Butte for Salvation Army**

Cousins, divisional head of the Salvation army in five western states in which Montana is included, is in Butte conferring with Campaign Manager Crittenden and Divisional Campaign Manager Fred Townroe relative to raising \$25,000 for the Butte Salvation army corps. The fund is to be used in building a Salvation army home in the mining camp.

**Charged With Falsely Wearing U. S. Uniform**

Special to The Daily Tribune. Helena, June 27.—Information was filed and warrant issued by the federal court today for R. F. Bernard, held in Butte on charges of falsely wearing a uniform of a United States soldier. The suit of M. Janse against L. A. Metzler was dismissed as settled. In bankruptcy, Charles R. Burch and Daniel R. Chase were adjudged bankrupt and their cases referred to referees. The hearing on the petition for discharge of H. R. Spang was set for July 30. Thomas Lochray, A. B. Rector and James B. Fallis were discharged.

**Fierce Fire Burning in Absaroka Forest**

Livingston, June 27.—Fire burning fiercely in Sweetgrass canyon, east of the Crazy mountains, was reported this afternoon to the office of Supervisor E. W. Shaw of the Absaroka national forest. Late this afternoon Supervisor Shaw was informed that the fire was making rapid headway and that men were being gathered by the sheriff of Sweetgrass county to combat the flames. Fire fighting apparatus also is being assembled in Livingston to be shipped to the scene tomorrow morning.
