

First Championship Fight Picture Received From East; Victor and Vanquished Awaiting Count

Great Falls Ball Fans Jubilant With Outlook

Believed Manager E. H. Quiggin of Smelter Aggregation Has Whipped Together a Lineup That Is About to Take Championship of Montana; Have Games.

Great Falls baseball fans are waking up to the fact that right here at home they have a baseball team that has shown during the past two weeks it is second to none in the state and its looks now as if Manager E. H. Quiggin of the smelter team has whipped together a lineup that will this season bring home the "bacon" said "bacon" and believe the Smelter team will have to be recognized if Havre wants the championship honors.

It has readily been touted for some time that Havre had the most formidable team in the state. But when the Smelter lineup was pitted against the Bear Cats there was a different story. Havre fans still believe they have the best nine in the country, but outsiders now believe the Smelter team will have to be recognized if Havre wants the championship honors.

Crowd Reaches 5,000. The Smelter team arrived home early Monday morning after riding by automobile all night from Havre where they played three games, July 4, 5, and 6. The fourth game was a spirited 7 to 6 tie contest, filled with brilliant fielding and little hitting. The game on Saturday, due largely, Manager Quiggin says, to the fact the Smelter boys had to sleep in a sample room, all crowded together in the Havre hotel, thus procuring but a few hours poor rest at the most, ended in a victory for Havre, 12 to 2.

However, Sunday, with Jack Armatage twirling and allowing the Bear Cats but four measly hits, the Smelter lineup won out, 6 to 4. The game was a beauty from start to finish and was witnessed by approximately 5,000 people, one of the largest ever witnessing a ball game in this state.
