

## BROOKS LEAVES RAINBOW DESK

### Head Clerk at Local Hotel Will Become Purchasing Agent for Oregon Resort.

The genial countenance of R. C. Brooks will not be seen at the Hotel Rainbow desk after September 1. He has accepted the position of purchasing agent at the Hot Lake, Oregon, hotel and health resort and will be located there permanently after the present month. Mr. Brooks has been a member of the force at the Rainbow for the past 5 1/2 years, succeeding to the position of head clerk with the retirement of Ben Comings about two years ago. There are probably few hotel men in the state who have a larger acquaintance with the traveling public of Montana than Mr. Brooks and news of his departure will be received with general regret. Heavy responsibilities attach to the position of purchasing agent at the Hot Lake hotel, which is the only hotel at one of Oregon's famous resorts. The sanitarium conducted in connection with the hotel was established because of the medical properties contained in the water and annually attracts guests from all parts of the country. Before coming to Great Falls in 1913 Mr. Brooks was with a hotel at Missoula. Mr. Brooks will be succeeded as chief clerk at the Rainbow by K. G. Beverlin, now of the day desk force. Ed O'Donnell and E. H. Rhodes will hereafter be the clerks on duty during the day and the position of night clerk will be open with the advancement of Mr. Rhodes. Mr. O'Donnell has been at the desk with Mr. Beverlin on the day shift heretofore.
