MEXICO DISBANDED SISAL TRUST; MONEY CRISIS IS RESULT

Treasurer Refuses to Receive Its Depreciated Paper or to Extend Federal Aid.

Washington, Oct. 18.—Liquidation of the commission reguladora, the sisal growers' organization in Yucatan, ordered by the Yucatan government because of the depreciation of the paper money silver, have combined to create another financial crisis in Mexico, according to official advices received in Washington.

Luis Cabrera, secretary of the treasury, a few months ago refused to accept reguladora paper in payment of taxes and from that date the depreciation of the paper became rapid.


Chippendale

Thomas Chippendale was the dominant figure in English furniture design from 1730 to 1780. He manifested fondness for the combination of French Gothic and Chinese designs.




Jacobean

During the reign of James the First, the influence of Italian cabinet makers was felt in the design of English furniture, and this is reflected in the above Edison case.



Sheraton

Thomas Sheraton was the most artistic of all the Georgian designers. He loved straight lines and was a master in the use of inlay.



Hepplewhite

George Hepplewhite was a contemporary of Sheraton, but preferred to secure his effects by carvings rather than inlay.
