DECLINED CITIZENSHIP ONCE, WAR VETERAN REJECTED NOW

Andrew Stone, a native of Norway, and during the war with Germany an American soldier, was denied the privilege of becoming a United States citizen by Judge J. B. Leslie in the district court Wednesday.

to accept citizenship when at Camp Lewis following his induction into the service and that he endeavored to evade military duty because of his status as an alien.

Stone frankly admitted the assertion of Examiner Thomas. He had not wanted to serve in the army, he said, and asked for exemption on the ground that he was not a citizen.

No Other Course, Says Court

In substance the court told Stone that an alien who did not consider the United States worth fighting for in a time of stress could not reasonably expect to be welcomed as a citizen in time of peace.

The seven ex-service men admitted were George Gianoulis, Theo Pichavias, Nick Spilios, Marmis Jarner, John Burkland, Frederick Gigli, and Abel Malinas.

In examining candidates for citizenship who appeared in the district court Wednesday, Mr. Thomas in each case dwelt at length on the petitioner's ideas relative to the Industrial Workers of the World.

Examiner Thomas stated that he did not know of a court that would admit an I. W. W. to citizenship, an opinion that was concurred in by Judge Leslie.

Wednesday was naturalization day in the district court. Six men additional to those who had served with the colors were admitted, their names and nationalities being:

Joseph Evans Pallen, England; Daniel D. Buckley, Ireland; William Allan Thumason, England; Angelo Marzetti, Italy; Rudolph Wulff, Germany; Roy C. Hartick, France.
