

# IT TURNED OUT REAL JUICE UNTIL SHERIFF GRABBED IT

The largest and most complete whisky still located by the force of Sheriff J. P. Burns since the prohibition law went into effect, was uncovered and seized at 2123 Eighth avenue north last Wednesday by Deputies W. C. Bean and E. J. Tait. Adolph Arnold, a former brewery worker and who is said to have admitted to the deputies that he owned and had operated the plant, was arrested at the Last Chance soft drink stand, 1923 Eighth avenue north, shortly

after the still was discovered. He is held at the county jail in default of \$500 bond and will probably be prosecuted in the federal court. Ten barrels of fermenting mash, 400 pounds of sugar several sacks of barley and corn and a large quantity of equipment and accessories were seized with the still. Three gallons of moonshine, alleged to have been manufactured in the still, were located in the building. This, according to Arnold's admission to the sheriff, was the plant's output for one day. The still is a double-boiler affair with two spouts leading down

to the coils, the latter contained in barrels of water. The whisky alleged to have been manufactured by Arnold is of the highest grade produced by any of the stills located in Cascade county to date. It does not contain formaldehyde, extracts or any of the ingredients commonly used by the small operator in making prohibited beverages. Sheriff Burns suspects that the output of the still was disposed of at one place and that the owner found it good business to keep the whisky at a high standard after establishing a permanent trade.

ly to it and that the promoters feel certain it will meet with popular favor everywhere as soon as the campaign for its extension can be launched.
