TOYS WRAPPED FOR CHILDREN

More Than 350 "Kiddies" Will Know What Christmas Means Next Tuesday.

The busy whirl and noisy hum of a rushed department store in holiday season made the sabbath at the Overland-Great Falls garage seem like an ordinary work day Sunday. All during the day from early morning until the stars of twinkling twilight announced the approach of night this noisy activity continued.

When silence came over the place and the hum had died down stacked up in the corner of the garage was a pile of Christmas packages that would produce a "grand and glorious feeling" in the hearts of the most hardened skeptic. Members of the Rotary club, business men and Red Cross workers had spent the whole day in wrapping up the large collection of Christmas toys which had been given for the children not able to get their own gifts and play things.

Christmas toys for 350 children representing about 100 families were neatly tied up in Christmas packages by this conscientious corps of every day Santa Clauses. The same workers will fail in again Tuesday and visit the homes to which these toys are designated and surprise the 350 children with real play things.

The distribution will be made to those children who, after a thorough canvass have been found to be most in need of some reminder of the Christmas spirit. A large number will be sent to the children of dry land farmers whose addresses can be found. Investigation developed the fact that the boys and girls of those farmers were greatly in need of toys and steps will be taken to assist them.

The work of wrapping and tying up the toys was a no ordinary task but the workers went about their work with the spirit of the season. From the hum of mirth and happy activity no passerby could tell that these people were doing hard work although most of them felt when night came that they had had a difficult business day.

Great Batch of Toys for Orphan Pupils

Butte, Dec. 21.—Fifteen hundred dollars worth of toys, candy and gifts for the 198 children at the state orphan's home at Twin Bridges were loaded at the Northern Pacific depot this afternoon by a few good fellows of the city.
