## Five Hundred Good Road Enthusiasts to Visit Billings

 Billings, Dec. 25.—More than 500 Montana good road enthusiasts are expected to be in Billings on Jan. 8 and 9. The annual convention of the Eastern Montana Good Roads association, which is composed of members in all Montana from Gallatin county east to the North Dakota line, will be held on Jan. 8. On the following day the Montana High Improvement association, formed at Great Falls last month with a membership of 350, will meet.  
 The organized movement for better roads in Montana is considered to have started with the good roads convention

held in Billings in June, 1910. W. B. George was chairman of the meeting and L. M. King of Missouri, the inventor of the split-log road drag, was the principal speaker.
