VARSITY CAMPAIGN FOR BIG BOND ISSUE OPENS OVER STATE

Attempt Will Be Made to Get 20,000 Signers to Petitions to Initiate Measure.

The campaign of the University of Montana for a bond issue and a special tax levy, for erection of buildings and maintenance, is being started over the state this week, according to word reaching Great Falls, W. F. Brewer, campaign manager with offices at Helena, has sent out the petition forms which will be circulated from March 20 to April 20. It is announced that attempt will be made to get 20,000 signers to these petitions, 10,000 more than the number of signatures required to take the two proposals before the voters in November.

The University of Montana, as well as four non-university institutions under the state board of education, is to be the beneficiary of a proposed bond issue of \$5,000,000 and a special tax levy of one and one-half mills. The measures are inaugurated, it is explained, because of the critical condition of Montana's higher educational institutions. The raising of the state assessed valuation above \$600,000,000 this year will by constitutional provision lower the legal rate for all state purposes and, since neither the expenses of other state institutions nor the cost of state government can be lowered, it is believed certain that the cut will be levelled at the institutions of higher learning. At present, they announce, the educational institutions are operating on very inadequate finances and the next year shows hope only that such finances will be cut in half unless the people of the state provide for special funds for new buildings and a fixed maintenance.

According to the statement from Mr. Brewer's office, district chairman for the petition signing campaign have been appointed in all of the districts of the state and county chairmen in most of the counties.
