## DOCTORS CONCLUDE DIVORCE STRUGGLE IN DISTRICT COURT

### Husband Finishes Story; Wife Denies Everything; Arguments This Morning.

Although certain of the more sensational features seemed to be eliminated as the Doctor divorce trial continued in Judge J. B. Leslie's department of district court Thursday afternoon, both parties submitted charges, counter charges and denials of a nature to cause the suit to stand out quite unique among the actions tried during the present jury term. The plaintiff, Grace E. Doctor, brought the suit on the grounds of cruelty and the defendant, Theodore S. Doctor, filed a counter suit alleging cruelty and infidelity. The struggle before the jury has been to determine which shall receive the decree and have custody of their 3-year-old daughter.

The defendant Thursday told the jury his reason for believing his wife's relations with other men had been improper and gave his account of how she allegedly burned him with a hot flat-iron, tramped upon him while he was lying on the floor, played jazz phonograph records to insult him, banged him over the head with a light fixture and threw him out of the house. Harry Herring, witness for the husband, testified that he once called on Mrs. Doctor and that shortly before midnight she advised him to "beat it

while the going was good," for "the old man would be coming home in a few minutes." Doctor was then working at the smelter, his shift ending at midnight. Mrs. Winnie Gosney, another witness for the defense, told the jury that Mrs. Doctor once admitted to her that she had been unfaithful to her husband. In her own behalf, Mrs. Doctor denied the acts of cruelty alleged by her husband, giving explanations intended to show that he had been the aggressor on the occasions referred to by him. She denied ever having made the alleged admissions referred to by Mrs. Gosney. The incident at the Warren shack in the country, introduced by the husband, the defendant had taken her and another woman there when he went fishing. Doctor admitted that her statement was correct.

Arguments will be made to the jury this (Friday) morning.

## PENALTY OF DEATH CARRIED BY VERDICT BUTTE MURDER CASE

### Third of Four Defendants in Prenatt Killing Is Convicted; One Yet to Try.

Butte, April 8.—Theodore Chronos, third man to be tried on the charge of murder in connection with the fatal shooting of Sylvester J. Prenatt in a battle with four masked men at his home in Butte on the morning of December 9, 1919, was found guilty of murder in the first degree and penalty fixed at death by hanging by the verdict of the jury returned at 8 o'clock tonight. In his closing argument to the jury county attorney Nick Rotering declared that Patrolman Andrew Brady of the city police force and Edgar A. MacIntosh, a taxi-cab driver, will also be charged with murder as the result of evidence in the trial of Chronos. Tom Williams and Steve Byrne. Williams was convicted and his penalty fixed at life imprisonment in the state penitentiary and Byrne found guilty and his penalty fixed at hanging. Gust Andros, charged with being the fourth man of the party, will be tried next.

### David Rankin Dies at Home Near Spionkop

Word was received by Sheriff James P. Burns, Wednesday afternoon, that David Rankin, one of the well known ranchers of that section, died suddenly Wednesday afternoon. The cause of the death was not stated by Sheriff Burns informant. He had been a resident of the Spionkop country for a long period and was well and favorably known there. He had engaged in ranching and cattle raising and has real estate holdings of about two sections of land. He was about 55 years of age.
