

The total resources of such institutions are \$25,965,675,836.30. These statistics have been compiled by Secretary R. N. Sims of the National Association of Supervisors of State Banks. There are also in the United States 7,705 National banks with total resources of \$20,709,550,000.00. The total number of banking institutions in the United States is therefore 28,733 with total resources of \$46,765,225,836.30.

A large percentage of the membership of the State Bank section consists of institutions capitalized at \$25,000 or less and as a consequence this section is recognized as particularly representing the interests of country bankers.

BEATS 'VAG' CHARGE BY SHOWING PROOF OF \$950 ON DEPOSIT

Peter Lozanos Dismissed by Police Magistrate When He Proves He Has Money.

One who has no visible means of support, but has sufficient funds to live in not a vagrant even though he roams about the city, wanders from one pool hall to another and habitually passes is time playing cards, according to a decision made by Police Magistrate George Haban Tuesday in passing on the evidence introduced by Captain Fred Locher and Officer William Murray against Peter Lozanos, former pool hall proprietor.

Lozanos was arrested last week on a vagrancy charge and at the trial Tuesday admitted that he has not been employed since disposing of his place of business last December.

He has since then had sufficient money to meet his expenses, he stated to the magistrate, and at the present time has \$950 on deposit at the Great Falls grocery, First avenue south and Park drive. The proprietor of this store corroborated Lozanos' statement in this regard.

The officers arrested the defendant at the Black Eagle soft drink stand, Murray testifying that Lozanos was one of several men who scrambled away from card table at that place and made motions as if putting money in his pocket.

This instance, combined with the alleged fact that the defendant had not been employed for four months and was generally to be seen on the streets and about pool halls and card rooms until late at night caused him to come under suspicion as a vagrant, the officers declared.

Lozanos, the proprietors of the Great Falls grocery and the Pacific grocery are Greeks and they all testified that men of their nationality frequently do their banking business at the stores on First avenue south. Both proprietors stated that they have received up to \$3,000 in deposits in a single day.
