Cincinnati Forges Ahead and Cleveland Americans Back in Old Form.

New York, May 16.—The Cincinnati world's champions and the Cleveland Americans recovered their stride last week and again lead their respective leagues. The Chicago Nationals jumped into third place today by winning their seventh straight victory.

In the National league, Cincinnati batted hard and fielded well except in the game dropped to New York when the Reds were unable to score on Benton Reuther, of Cincinnati, allowed St. Louis two hits and no runs last Sunday.
