

### PENNY LUXURY TAX HAS AN IMPORTANT PART IN TRADE NOW

Deputy Collector T. Roy Hazelrigg Says Merchants Will Be Held Strictly to Account.

Montanans can no longer boast of the uselessness of the penny. Since the adoption of the individual income tax and the luxury tax they have become indispensable. And the penny is an absolute necessity in the soft drink and ice cream parlors.

The luxury tax is one cent on each ten cents or fraction thereof and as a result much difficulty is being experienced by the officers of the internal revenue department to make individuals and firms understand the correct meaning of this tax.

T. Roy Hazelrigg, deputy collector in charge of the local office has made the following statement in regard to the luxury tax:

**Tax on Ice Cream.**  
"In the first place many individuals have a misunderstanding that there is no tax on ice cream cones. All ice cream cones are taxable and merchants cannot possibly get away from the use of pennies for the following reasons: The cost of lemonade is to an individual 13 cents plus 2 cents tax making a total of 15 cents. Therefore an individual buys two lemonades one for himself and a friend, the cost is twice 13 cents or 26 cents and a tax of 3 cents only can be added because the law plainly states one cent on each 10 cents or fraction thereof, making a total of 29 cents. This applies in all cases where several articles taxable may be sold to one individual. If two persons should go in and each buy a lemonade in "dutch treat" fashion the drinks then would cost 30 cents. So it is one cent cheaper for one person to pay for the two drinks, and split the difference afterward.

**Must Keep Record.**  
"Many merchants are lax in that they are not keeping daily records and henceforth this part of the law will be rigidly enforced by this office. Furthermore those merchants who are not advertising the price and the tax to the customer will also be called to account. This is compulsory either by cards where they can be seen or on a menu.

"Last year the field men were indulgent with merchants as the law was new, now there is a local office in the city and the people have no reason to plead ignorance. Grief is surely to come to those who in any way deviate from the regulations."



He earns \$3.75 per day and has \$100 worth of property, it is stated.

**Veneral Diseases.**  
The campaign against veneral diseases now nation-wide in its scope, is advancing slowly but surely toward effectiveness. It has been under a great handicap from the start. Other diseases, though unpleasant topics for discussion, have been discussed widely and openly. Efforts toward controlling or eliminating them have not been handicapped by a confusion of moral and medical aspects or an attitude of pseudo-modesty. The terrible physical effects of syphilis and gonorrhea have been left during the past to the consideration of the medical profession almost entirely. "See no evil, speak no evil, hear no evil," as depicted by the familiar group of simians of the circus shows, has been the general attitude toward these scourges of the human race.

When our boys began to mobilize at the training camps, and the army authorities began their campaign against veneral diseases, the newspapers, recognizing that the fathers and mothers were anxious for any news affecting their sons, began to give a much needed publicity to this campaign, and the words "veneral diseases" began to find their place in the public prints.

It is one of the peculiarities of the English language that two words derived from a single root may acquire opposite characteristics from usage.

From the root word Venus, goddess of love, are derived "renerate" and "veneral." The former is used to signify reverence and respect while the latter has been applied to a group of diseases, and because these are often acquired in an illegitimate manner, odium has attached to it. It is a deplorable mistake to regard the unfortunate victim of any of these diseases as a social outcast. He is rather the unfortunate victim of a false system of education.
