"MENKARA" IS NAME GIVEN TO MONTANA MOSQUE OF SHEIKS

Order Instituted Here Last Tuesday With 40 Charter Members; Ceremonial in October.

Menkara Mosque No. 3, Ancient Tribe of Sheiks, was instituted in Great Falls Tuesday night, June 29. Bradley C. Marks of Fargo, N. D., grand master of the A. O. U. W., conducted the institution. There were 40 charter members, several of whom were from out-of-town. The ceremonies began with a banquet and reception to the grand master and out of town members at the Park hotel, following which the institution took place. The following are the elective officers:

The name "Menkara" is the name of the third pyramid built in Egypt and was chosen because the workmanship of this pyramid was superior to the first two and also because of the fact that this is the third mosque to be instituted, making the name appropriate and suggestive. This mosque will have jurisdiction over Montana, only one mosque being permitted in a state. It will also have jurisdiction over the state of Idaho until such time as it may be advisable to institute one in Idaho.

The first ceremonial will be held October 27, at which time the first novices will make the journey across the sands. The mosque has already started active work in preparation for this ceremonial. Several prominent sheiks from other states will be present at the ceremonial. The first shipment of paraphernalia to arrive will be the fezes which must be worn by all sheiks while attending the subordinate lodge sessions.
