

# 1920 TAX PAYMENT NOTICES TO GO OUT DURING NEXT WEEK

### Total This Year Will Be Less Because of Decreases in Livestock Holdings.

Reminders that the season for tax payments has again arrived will be mailed from the office of County Treasurer Fred C. Andretta next week. Preparation of the notices for the 14,000 property owners in Cascade county will be begun in the treasurer's office next Monday, October 4, following delivery of the books by Clerk John E. Moran.

The first notices will be in the mail before the end of the week and collections are expected to begin to come in soon. The exact amount of all taxes to be collected will not be known until the treasurer receives the books from Clerk Moran, but that the total will be less than last year was discovered when Assessor John L. Gillin completed his canvass of the county last June. Decreases in livestock holdings are responsible for the reduction in the county's valuation. Paul Hagen, recently with the United States marines, will become a permanent deputy in Treasurer Andretta's office as soon as the books are received. Mr. Hagen was appointed deputy treasurer last May and since then has been with the books in the office of the assessor and clerk.
