THE ISTHMIAN TROUBLES. The action of the United States during the late troubles on the isthmus of Panama has not been understood by a large portion of the intelligent readers of the published accounts of the part taken by the United States navy in that connection.

By the treaty with New Granada (now Colombia) the United States undertook to guarantee and protect free transit across the isthmus, and as a second stipulation also guaranteed "the rights of sovereignty which New Granada has and possesses over said territory."
