"Too Rich to Marry" at the opera house tonight.

The Fraternal Brotherhood ball will be given in the opera house New Year's Eve.

Frank Putnam came in yesterday to spend a few days with friends, and will leave for California early next month.

Professor J. A. Rockefeller returned yesterday from Tombstone, where he has been spending the holidays with his family.

A number of Bisbeeites will attend the bull fight at Naco today and will help the Tucson aggregation enjoy the day in the border city.

J. N. Jones has moved back the small house owned by him near the Kinsey house and will erect a two story dwelling in its place.

A private telegram was received in Bisbee yesterday stating that copper was quoted at eleven cents for casting brands on the New York exchange.

Burt Grover is rapidly recovering from the effects of the gunshot wound he received several weeks ago through the accidental discharge of a shotgun.

There are eighteen prisoners serving sentences varying from ten to thirty days in the Bisbee jail, a number of these having been sent up from Naco.

Geo. Dunn has on exhibition at his place a very pretty pair of steer horns. The work of polishing and mounting them was done by Ed McDonald who is an artist in this special line.

The two story brick building built by Sam Medigovich will be ready for occupancy about January 10th. The lower floor will be used as a store and the second story will be occupied by Mr. Medigovich and family.

The brick work on the gymnasium was resumed yesterday, a sufficient number of brick masons having arrived from different places to start the work. Work will be pushed as fast as possible and the company will endeavor to have the building ready for use before the end of the coming year.

### Persuasive Pikers

"They are pretty much excited over at Phoenix," said a well known traveling man last night, who had just arrived from the west, "about the alleged attempts of the business men in the southern California resorts to draw business, in other words tourists, away from the Arizona city. The impression prevails around the city that the business men of the southern California towns have organized a sort of a league, the purpose of which is to persuade people bound for Phoenix to continue on to the coast winter resorts, and it is the means said to be employed that makes the Phoenix people sore. If the reports are true they have a right to be sore. They claim that the California people keep a lot of pickers and cappers at work on all trains running between Albuquerque and the coast, whose business it is to hunt out all tourists and pour into their ears a sad story about the fatal results likely to occur from going to Phoenix. Stories about the unhealthy climate of the Salt River valley."

The matter has been brought to the attention of the Phoenix board of trade, who intend to make it a weary life for the southern California business men who are injuring the tourist business of the Arizona capital. The people of Phoenix are proud of the climate of the Salt River valley, and they mean to take vigorous action against the persuasive pickers whom they believe are drawing away from them the lucrative tourist and health seeker.
