

Tucson Instructor Has Been Dismissed

TROUBLE AT THE UNIVERSITY—STUDENTS SHOW INSUBORDINATION.

Necessary to Call on an Officer of the Law to Remove a Refractory Student—President Babcock Stands Firm.

For some days past there has been trouble at the University as a result of insubordination and defiance of authority and the regulations on the part of some members of the student body.

A few days ago, one of the instructors, Mr. B. F. Stacy, was dismissed from the institution because he visited a house of prostitution in company with some of the students. Mr. Stacy, it is understood, claimed that he made the visitation referred to in the line of his studies, but his explanation was not satisfactory to President Babcock.

Mr. Stacy, it seems, was popular with the student body and some of the "Profs" resented his dismissal and indulged in general insubordination. The discipline committee of the faculty has been making an investigation for some days past and several of the students have been called to testify. Some of them refused to answer questions and were suspended. Yesterday, one student named Millington was dismissed from the University for general misbehavior. He was ordered to leave the University grounds and refused and last night a warrant was sworn out for his arrest for misdemeanor. The officer who went to serve the warrant could not find him but it is reported that Millington appeared in the dormitory again this morning.

Millington is said to be 27 years old. He is an Englishman and has only been in this country about a year and a half. He was given a janitorship in the University by President Babcock last fall to enable him to earn a little money to defray his expenses, but he performed the duty in such a slipshod manner that it was found necessary to deprive him of the job. Since then he has been a mal-content and a disturber. It is said he admitted the authorship of some doggerel reflecting on President Babcock and also contributed some work to a recent episode in which it is said President Babcock was burned in effigy.

It is understood that the officer with the warrant has gone out to the University again this afternoon and it is probable that Millington will be put in the cooler before morning.

There are reports that several of the more aggressive offenders of the students may be suspended and some, perhaps, dismissed from the University.

President Babcock is determined to maintain discipline and order at the University and he is cordially supported by the faculty and the Board of Regents. There is no doubt, too, that the president will be sustained by the people of Arizona, whose taxes support and maintain the institution.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.—OF THE—BROPHY CARRIAGE COMPANY.

Know all men by these presents: That we, James E. Brophy, Thomas J. Brophy and Hugh J. Brophy, all of Bisbee, Cochise county, Territory of Arizona, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purposes of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and we do hereby certify, acknowledge, and adopt the following articles of incorporation.

The name of said corporation shall be "Brophy Carriage Company" and the principal place of business of said corporation shall be at Lowell, near town of Bisbee, Cochise County, Ari-

zona, with such other offices at such other places as the board of directors may determine.

II. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by said corporation is as follows: To buy and sell, and in any and every way deal in, either in its own right, or upon consignment, as factor, broker, or otherwise, carriages, wagons, buggies, and vehicles of all descriptions, horses and harnesses; to own, conduct, manage and control a general merchandise business for the sale of hay, grain, and all other species of personal property; to acquire and own stables and repositories for the housing of its merchandise, goods and wares; to in any and every way deal in, hold and own, all kinds of real and personal property; to make contracts, and acquire and transfer property, with all the powers and privileges in such respects as a natural person might or may have; and generally to do such other acts and things as may be necessary, useful or convenient to the proper conduct of the business of said corporation in the Territory of Arizona, or elsewhere, not contrary to the laws of the United States, or said Territory of Arizona.

III. The authorized amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars, divided into two hundred and fifty (250) shares of the par value of one hundred (\$100) dollars each, which said stock shall be sold, either for cash, or in exchange for personal and real property, to enable said corporation to acquire property necessary to carry on its business; balance, if any, to remain in the treasury subject to the disposition of the board of directors by a majority vote thereof. All stock to be forever non-assessable.

IV. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of a certified copy of these articles with the Territorial Auditor, in the manner provided by law, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter.

V. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of directors, said board to consist of three members. For the transaction of the business of this corporation there shall also be elected by the board of directors the following officers: A president, secretary, treasurer and manager, and such other officers as said board may hereafter determine to be necessary. Two of such offices may be held by one person. The board of directors shall be elected at the regular annual meeting of the stockholders to be held on the first Monday in April of each year. Such directors shall hold office for the term of one year; and until their successors are elected and qualified. The board of directors who shall have charge of the affairs of this corporation until the first meeting of stockholders as provided herein, are as follows: James E. Brophy, Thomas J. Brophy and Hugh J. Brophy.

VI. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability, direct or contingent to which this corporation is at any time to subject itself, shall be two-thirds of its capital stock.

VII. The private property of the stockholders shall be exempt from liability or execution for the debts of the corporation.
