Tom Cunningham, one of the well known prospectors of this vicinity, and an owner in the Combination Group, will leave in a short time for Mammoth to look into the oil excitement. If satisfied with the result of his investigation he will take up land.

Owl Reopened.

The Owl Saloon, on Main street, formerly the Free Coinage, will be reopened today. Johnny Noble, a long resident of this county, is the new proprietor, and was formerly part owner of the Capitol. Johnny Noble numbers his friends by his acquaintances, and a number will be glad to know that he has returned to Bisbee to again engage in business.

Change of Venue.

An affidavit was filed by the defendants in the civil case of J. E. Mosher vs. J. A. Casey and Mrs. Casey, asking for a change of venue from Judge McDonald's Court. The motion was granted and the case was ordered to Judge Brown's Court. The writ is for the collection of an amount of \$209 which Mosher claims is due for meat purchased at his market.

Excursion Today.

Yesterday at a little after 11 o'clock Cervera and his troupe of banderillos paraded the main streets of Bisbee, attracting considerable attention. These men will appear today in the arena of the Agua Prieta bull ring for the last time, and fight to the death four bulls selected because of their particularly vicious tempers and apparent fighting qualities. An excursion train will leave here at 9:25 for Douglas, and will be the last bull fight excursion run by the E. P. & S. W. for some time. Fare, \$1.00 for round trip.

Mrs. Brodie Very Ill.

Mrs. Alexander O. Brodie was taken ill on Monday and has been in a serious condition, says the Phoenix Enterprise. Her physician states that there is no no cause for alarm, and he looks for her early recovery. Governor Brodie did not leave his home this morning owing to the illness of his wife.

Close Watch in Crowded Jail.

Deputy Sheriff Kerr brought over a Mexican for the county jail today from Douglas, says the Prospector. The prisoner makes No. 71, in the county bastille. With all the cells, corridors, insane ward and tanks filled to their full capacity, to say the jail is crowded is putting it lightly. Two guards are kept on duty at night, and two during the day, while every precaution against a jail break is being taken by Sheriff Lewis and his officials.

Work Will Be Resumed.

Arrangements have been going on for the past week toward resuming work at the Bisbee Con. on the first of the coming month. This property has been shut down for several weeks pending arrangements whereby the main shaft can be sunk to greater depth. At present the shaft shows a depth of 215 feet in highly mineralized formation. The property is situated on the main lead, and it is the opinion of the President of the Company that at a depth of fifty feet more ore can be shown. The improvements already made at the shaft site show abundance of faith in the success of the Bisbee Con.

Pittsburg and Hecla.

Extremely favorable reports come from the Pittsburg & Hecla people who are operating without drill in the Solomon Springs Valley country. During the past two weeks a decided change for the better has taken place in the formation. Heretofore conglomerate has been the prevailing formation in the shaft, but during the past few days sulphide indications in the rock has been encountered, and waste on the dump is fairly flecked with sulphide. The management is considering the drill, but as yet no definite plans have been arrived at. D. H. Collins, the superintendent on the ground, is elated at the present indications and sanguine of the outcome.

Developments in Casey Trial.

The territorial grand jury made a partial report yesterday evening returning two indictments against Alexander Casey. One for attempt to commit murder by shooting Constable Nabor Pacheco, and the other for an assault with a deadly weapon on an employe of the Willard Hotel. This infraction of the law occurred some months ago when Casey in a state of intoxication, shot up the Willard Hotel, which, although it is his own property, made it exceedingly dangerous to be around for about an hour. He has been in jail since his misfortune awaiting the action of the grand jury.—Tucson Star.

The Bisbee West.

Work is progressing in a quiet and unassuming way at the Bisbee West. The drift on the new shaft No. 3 has been driven in a couple of hundred feet, and results have been exceedingly gratifying. The drift is being run to tap an ore body that was encountered on an upper level. Ore in various stages of richness has been encountered from time to time, and in sufficient quantity to warrant the belief that the Bisbee West people have a mine of great magnitude. It is the ultimate intention of the company to erect a smelter when sufficient ore is found. The site for this improvement has already been selected. With the abundance of water at hand the smelter will not be lacking in that particular.
