\$6,600,000 Gold Goes On One Ship

HEAVY EXPORTS ON THE KAISER TODAY MAKE PANAMA PAYMENTS.

New York, April 30.—The Kaiser Wilhelm Der Grosse, which sailed this week, took \$6,600,000 in gold, which is being shipped to Paris by the leading foreign exchange houses in preparation for the Panama payments. Up to the close of business yesterday the following engagements had been announced:

Total \$6,600,000
Otto H. Kahn, of Kuhn, Loeb & Co., will sail for Europe today to conduct the exchange operations for his firm and the syndicate that are shipping gold.

Wall street was informed late yesterday that the actual payments will not be made by the Government until next week. The government has not yet received the necessary papers from Paris closing the transaction. When they arrive they must be inspected by the Attorney General before the title will be passed and the money paid. Foreign exchange bankers, however, say that by making remittances now the money can be employed to much better advantage in Paris than in New York until the time comes to draw against it for making the Paris settlement.

The gold to be shipped today is the largest sum ever sent abroad with one exception and that was on November 19, 1901, when the Kaiser Wilhelm Der Grosse carried \$7,330,000. The shipments tomorrow will make an aggregate of \$12,526,000 sent abroad since April 7. As against this has been received in the United States since Jan. 1, \$25,000,000 of Japanese gold.

"ONE WHO HAS SUFFERED" LEFT NOTE IN WHICH SHE QUOTES "THE WAGES OF SIN IS DEATH."

Niagara Falls, April 30. Who ever finds this: The wages of sin is death. Life is not worth the living to me, so I will end it all today. Hope my body will never be found. From one who has suffered.

This message written on a note which was pinned inside of a woman's hat was found today in a summer house that stands 500 feet back from the brink of the American Falls. No woman acting suspiciously has attracted the attention of the park employee. Supt. Parry believes the writer of the note reached town on a morning train and leaped into the river unseen. Her body was undoubtedly carried over the falls and will probably never be found. The hat left behind is of dark blue straw with flat crown and trimmed with blue and white straw, two straw roses and two blue feathers. If the woman found death in the river it is the second suicide of the season at the Falls.

Jury to Pass Upon Bryan as Executor

MRS. BENNETT APPEALS FROM THE SURROGATE'S REFUSAL TO REMOVE HIM.

New Haven, Conn., April 30.—William J. Bryan must fight to retain his position as executor of the will of Philo S. Bennett, who left him \$50,000 in a manner the legality of which is now in question before the Connecticut Supreme Court.

Today counsel for Mrs. Bennett, the widow, filed an appeal to the Superior Court from the decision of Probate Judge Cleveland, refusing to remove Mr. Bryan as executor. The charges against Mr. Bryan are that he is an unsuitable person to manage the estate; that he has wasted the estate and that his position as executor is inconsistent with his action in appealing as an individual and trustee under the will from the decision admitting the will to probate.

Judge Cleveland held that his appeal was taken only on the terms of the "stated letter" accompanying the will and was not inconsistent with his duty as executor. These questions will now be submitted to a jury.
