PROPOSALS FOR STAIRS ON SCHOOL HILL.

Sealed proposals are hereby invited by the City of Bisbee for the building of an extension to the upper road on School Hill, of the flight of stairs near the residence of T. J. Spalding. Said extension to be about 61 feet in length and of width corresponding to the present flight; of best quality Oregon pine lumber, sides of 2x12 planks, steps 2x12 mortised into sides 1-2 inch at each end, with 7 inch rise. Side planks are to be beveled at the joints and joined with two 1-2 inch iron bolts with washers. At intervals of 9 feet the sides are to be blocked with 4x4 mortised one inch on each side of stairs, with a 5-8 inch iron rod with washer on each end running through the blocks across the stairs. A strip of 2x4 is to be spiked flat on top of side plank on outside of stairs, bearing upon outer edge of steps.

Sealed proposals are also invited for the building of about 240 feet of stairs, with landings as in the present flight, to replace the stairs now in place past the residence of E. H. Wittig to that of Ed McSparrin on School Hill. In accordance with profile and sketch filed by the City Engineer in the office of the City Clerk. Specifications to be the same as above, except that the width is to be 4 feet from out to out. The steps to rise from 5 to 7 inches to conform to Engineer's profile and the cross rods are to be put in at the middle and at each joint of the side planks, except when the rise is such that side planks less than 9 feet must be used; in which case the cross rods are to be put in at the ends or joints of side planks only.

Proposals for either or both of above will be received at this office until Tuesday evening, February 7, 1905, at 3 o'clock, to be then opened, and should be in a sealed envelope marked "Proposals for building stairs on School Hill."

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check for ten per cent of the amount bid.
