The present length of the long No. 4 tunnel is 450 feet. In this tunnel we have more than 400 feet of pay ore. The breast of the tunnel is still in good ore and in fact the ore is improving as we go into the breast of the hill. This tunnel is connected with the surface by a ninety foot shaft eighty feet of which is in pay ore. There is a fifty foot winze from the tunnel which is all in ore. Work in the two lower tunnels is being prosecuted by three shifts of miners in each of them.
