AIRSHIP MEET FOR BISBEE IS NOW OFFERED

Promoter Gill of Los Angeles Writes Board of Trade, Offering to Make Success of Undertaking.

Douglas isn't the only one that gets the privilege of holding an aviation meet. So far she's got it on Bisbee in the respect of actual happening, but that's no sign Bisbee hasn't the chance.

Yesterday morning Secretary Reynolds of the board of trade received communication from Howard W. Gill, of Los Angeles, a promoter of aviation meets. He states he will guarantee to give Bisbee a two or three-day exhibition of the men-birds providing the citizens are willing to take hold and boost the thing along.

Mr. Gill says he has managed several of the recent ventures and can furnish besides the best references, all kinds of peace comments and other data necessary to establish his claim as a bona fide promoter.

Secretary Reynolds wrote back to him asking that he send all the propaganda he has relative to aviation meets, stating that the matter will be carefully considered here and perhaps acted upon favorably later on.

If Bisbee could pull the crowd that Douglas is getting right now, the proposition would certainly be more than worth while. Flights could be made at Warren; if not at the ball park, probably at the Country club.

CHINAMEN LEASE THE WARREN RANCH

INSTEAD OF BEING EMPLOYED, THEY WILL BE THE WHOLE THING ON FARM.

When a recent report from Tombstone stated that a portion of the Warren ranch, owned by Hoval A. Smith, had been leased to Fairbanks parties who were to work Chinamen on the property, it was not known that the Fairbanks parties to whom the lease had been made were Chinamen themselves.

But according to local reports, such seems to be the case. Two of them at Fairbanks are in on the deal and will themselves take charge of the leased property March 1, and raise vegetables thereon. They will employ six or eight Chinamen in the work of cultivation. They have leased 160 acres instead of 150.

LAST LANDMARKS OF EARLY MAIN ST. GONE

FRIDAY'S FIRE WIPED OUT BUILDINGS THAT HAVE BEEN GOLD MINES IN PAST.

The fire of Friday night which destroyed the old frame store building, obliterated some old land marks which have netted their owner many thousand dollars in rents from a small investment.

The old English Kitchen and the old Orient building, which was occupied by the Royal Theater, were historic buildings in the growth of Bisbee. In earlier days the English Kitchen was known as the Queen restaurant and changed its name to the "English Kitchen" under the management of Wm. Truax. The Orient building was formerly the "Fashion" saloon under the management of F. S. Douglas.

A few days before the fire the Old Annex building was torn down to make way for the erection of the handsome bank building of the Citizens Bank and Trust Co.

With the burning of the frame buildings on Friday night the last vestige of the earlier class of buildings on Main street has disappeared. In their place will soon be erected new and modern brick buildings. Yesterday M. J. Cunningham stated that he was certain Mr. Brophy, owner of the English Kitchen building, would erect a modern building immediately. The Orient Realty Co., composed of J. J. Walsh, A. E. Downs and Scott Whaley, have announced that they will build again on the old site, although definite plans have not yet been considered.

Citizens who witnessed the fire Friday night were complimentary in their remarks regarding the city's new fire service.
