ORDINANCE NO. 155. An Ordinance Amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 133. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BISBEE AS FOLLOWS: SECTION 1. That Section 6 of Ordinance No. 133 of the City of Bisbee, being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 57 of the City of Bisbee, Providing for the Appointment of a Building Inspector and Prescribing the Duties and Compensation of Such Officer and Providing for the Presentation of Plans and Specifications to Such Officer and fixing the Penalty for the Violation Thereof" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: SECTION 6. Said Building Inspector shall charge a fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) which shall be collected in advance for issuing such permit and for examining said plans and specifications and inspecting the building or addition provided for therein; said \$4.00 shall be retained by said Building Inspector as his compensation. It shall be the duty of said Building Inspector to file all the plans and Specifications passed upon by him in the office of the City Clerk of Said City: SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval by the Common Council and publication in the manner required by law. Any Proprietor, owner or employee of any proprietor or owner of any Saloon, place or store in the City of Bisbee where spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors are sold at retail who shall violate any of the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars or imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in addition there to the Common Council of said City may at its option, after such conviction, revoke the License of such owner or proprietor and any license money that may have been paid shall be forfeited. SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 152 of the City of Bisbee and all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed. SECTION 4. Every person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding One Hundred (\$100) Dollars, or be imprisoned in the City Jail for a period not to exceed Two Months or by both such fine and imprisonment. SECTION 2. Any Proprietor, owner or employee of any proprietor or owner of any Saloon, place or store in the City of Bisbee where spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors are sold at retail who shall violate any of the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars or imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in addition there to the Common Council of said City may at its option, after such conviction, revoke the License of such owner or proprietor and any license money that may have been paid shall be forfeited. SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 152 of the City of Bisbee and all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed. SECTION 4.
