The lightweight boxing limit will remain at 133 pounds. It has generally been expected that the limit would be raised to 135 pounds, but Willie Ritchie, who recently transferred the championship crown from the head of Ad Wolgast to his own, and who therefore has the final say as to weights, has announced that the limit will not be changed.

And speaking of Wolgast, the little German has no cause to shed tears about his loss of the championship--from a financial point, at least. While he was champion he received \$2,000.00. Nearly the whole was being added down and Wolgast is now rated as one of the wealthiest pugilists in the country.

The Yale University athletic commission has started a crusade against the summer baseball practice. Any student who plays ball during the summer and receives a compensation will be barred from trying for a position on the college team.

The lowly preliminary scrappers on the Pacific coast have formed a union and there will be no more starvation wages. In the past the promoters have usually given the "prelim" scrappers a postage stamp and let it go at that, but the new union will draft a scale of wages that will make the champion scrappers curl up with envy.

It claims that the English two minute round is responsible for the many defeats of English champions, in that the short rounds make the English scrappers lazy. An American fighter, boxing contends, has to put in more training and is thus in better condition for a fight, owing to the longer rounds in vogue in this country.

MEXICO WILL IMPROVE COAST

Announcement Made That Millions Will Be Spent on Harbor at Guaymas and Other Points

WORK STARTS JAN. 1

Announcement that the Mexican government will make improvements amounting from eight to ten million pesos in ports on the west coast of Mexico was made in Tucson by Mexican Consul Anaya on authority of a telegram received from the Mexican capital.

The improvements will start immediately after the first of the year. These improvements had been under consideration for some time but the resumption of peace in the lower republic and the consequent need of work for thousands of men prompted an earlier beginning of these improvements.

"The object of the improvement is dual," said Consul Anaya. "The improvement of the harbors is of course the main consideration. The west coast is one of the most fertile sections of the republic and the improvement of harbors will result in better facilities for developing its resources. Another purpose is to furnish work for the people."

Four million pesos will be spent on improving the harbor and shipping facilities at Guaymas which will include new piers of modern type. From four to six million pesos will be spent in improving the harbor at Mazatlan. This scheme of improvement work will start on January 1, according to Consul Anaya.

The details of the improvement will be worked out at conferences between Governor Martorena, President Calderon and cabinet officers at Mexico during the coming month, the governor having left for Mexico City last week.

Prior to the governor's departure the merchants and business men of Guaymas met with the governor at a banquet board and the governor invited the citizens to make suggestions as to the improvements contemplated. The harbor engineer was also present at this meeting and made a talk on the improvements needed.
