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CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT TO

THE CHARTER

of the

EL PASO & SOUTHWESTERN

RAILROAD COMPANY

At a meeting of the stockholders of the

El Paso & Southwestern Railroad Com-

pany, held at the office of the

Copper Queen Consolidated Mining

Company, at the City of Bisbee, Coun-

ty of Cochise, Territory of Arizona,

on the 12th day of September, A. D. 1912,

pursuant to a call for that purpose,

at which all of the stockholders of the

company were present in person or

by proxy, the following resolution

was duly proposed and adopted by the

unanimous vote of all the stock-

holders:

RESOLVED, That Article VIII of the

Articles of Incorporation of the

El Paso & Southwestern Railroad Com-

pany be, and the same is hereby

amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII. Said corporation is

organized under and in pursuance of

the laws of the Territory of Arizona,

for the purpose of owning, construct-

ing, maintaining and operating a rail-

road, with suitable telegraph and tel-

ephone lines, for the purpose of the

transportation and carriage of pas-

sengers and freight, by the force of

steam, electricity or other mechanical

power, or any combination thereof,

from Don Luis Station on The Ariz-

ona and Southeastern Railroad, in the

County of Cochise, Territory of

Arizona, to a point on the International

Boundary line between the

United States and Mexico at or near

the place where the Agua Prieta,

otherwise known as the White River,

flows south from the Territory of

Arizona into Mexico, and from this

point in a northeasterly direction to

the boundary line between the Ter-

ritory of Arizona and New Mexico, at

or near a point on said boundary

line which lies about fourteen hun-

dred and nineteen (119) feet east of

the northeast corner of Section three

(3), Township nineteen (19) South of

Range thirty-two (32) East, Gila and

Salt River Meridian.

Also for the purpose of owning,

constructing, maintaining and operat-

ing a branch railroad from the Town

of Fairbank in the County of Cochise

aforesaid, in an easterly direction to

of the Territory of Arizona in such

case made and provided.

Said corporation may also cross,

intersect, join and unite its railroad

with any other railroad that has been

heretofore constructed, or that may

hereafter be constructed, at any point

or points on the route thereof, and

upon the grounds of such other rail-

road companies, with the necessary

turnouts, sidings and switches, and

such other conveniences and appli-

ances as may be necessary to make

and complete said crossings, inter-

sections and connections; and may

extend its line of railroad into or

through the Territory of New Mexico,

and any other territory or state, upon

such terms and regulations as are or

may be prescribed by such territories

or states.

AND RESOLVED, That the Presi-

dent and Secretary of this company

certify a copy of the foregoing resolu-

tions under their respective hands

and the common and corporate seal of

the company, and file the same with

the Secretary of the Territory of Ariz-

ona.

ARTICLE II.

The name of said corporation is and

shall be "THE JOHNSON MEAT

COMPANY," and its principal place

of business at Bisbee, in Cochise

County, State of Arizona, and such

other branch offices or places of busi-

ness, as the Board of Directors may

from time to time deem necessary to

establish.

ARTICLE III.

The general nature of the business

proposed to be transacted by said

corporation, is to engage both at

wholesale and retail in the butcher

business, and of buying, selling and

dealing in meats food products, and

kindred articles, slaughtering cattle,

hogs, sheep, goats, and all animals

suitable for food, and raising the

same, and to carry on and engage in

the business of packing, curing, pre-

serving and storage of meats and food

products, to carry on and maintain

refrigerating and cold storage plants,

and to engage in the business of buy-

ing, selling and dealing in groceries,

hardware, implements, feed, hay,

grain, coal, fuel, and merchandise gen-

erally, and to carry on and maintain

stores and shops for the purposes

aforesaid.

To each, buy, sell and deal in real

estate, and to lease, mortgage and

hypothecate the same. To own, buy, sell

and deal in mortgage, pledge or by-

potheque personal property of every

kind, and to own, buy, sell in notes,

bonds, mortgages and securities. To

loan and borrow money.

ARTICLE IV.

The capital stock of this corpora-

tion is Five Thousand Dollars

(\$5000.00), consisting of 500

shares of the par value of One Hun-

dred Dollars (\$100.00) each. And

the time when, and the conditions on

which it is to be paid in are as fol-

lows: forty-five shares thereof have

been subscribed for by said corpora-

tion, in equal portions, the same to be

issued as soon as this corporation is

perfected, and is fully paid for by

the transfer to said corporation of

business, property, and money, nec-

essary to constitute the capital of the

corporation, and to conduct such pro-

posed business. The remaining five

shares, may be apportioned among

the existing stockholders, or sold,

when the Board of Directors may

deem advisable.

ARTICLE V.

The time of the commencement of

this corporation shall be upon the

filing of a certified copy of these Ar-

ticles in the office of the Recorder of

Cochise County, State of Arizona, and

its termination twenty-five years
