The amount of said bond issue shall be eighty thousand (\$80,000.00) Dollars in the aggregate and consist of eighty (80) Bonds of the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and shall be numbered from 1 to 80 inclusive and bear interest from their date at the rate of five and one half per cent (5 1/2%) per annum and both the principal and interest shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America and the bonds are to run as follows:--

Nov. 1 to 10, both inclusive to be due 2 yrs. from date.
Nov. 11 to 20, both inclusive to be due 3 yrs. from date.
Nov. 21 to 30, both inclusive to be due 4 yrs. from date.
Nov. 31 to 40, both inclusive to be due 5 yrs. from date.
Nov. 41 to 50, both inclusive to be due 6 yrs. from date.
Nov. 51 to 60, both inclusive to be due 7 yrs. from date.
Nov. 61 to 70, both inclusive to be due 8 yrs. from date.
Nov. 71 to 80, both inclusive to be due 10 yrs. from date.

Ordinance No 163. AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF BISBEE BY VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

Section 1. In no event shall any vehicle be operated or driven on any thoroughfare of this city at a speed in excess of six miles per hour within one hundred feet of approach of any corner, turn, intersection or crossing.

Section 2. All animals and vehicles moving on such thoroughfares shall be kept and driven to the right of the road in the direction of progress, except during such time as it would be immediately dangerous to life, limb or property so to do.

Section 3. Each section hereof shall be construed as independent enactments.

Section 4. The provisions of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 27 of this City, so far as it refers to vehicles, and Ordinance No. 175, being an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Use of the Streets of Bisbee, Arizona, by Automobiles, Motorcycles, and Vehicles of Like Character" and Ordinance No. 153 being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Limiting the Speed at Which Automobiles and Like Vehicles May be Driven and Prohibiting Immature Driving Thereof" are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of Sections 1, 2, 3 or 4 hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of \$100 or by imprisonment for not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and due publication as by law provided.
