

KIRKER COMES TO BOOST ROAD

Representative of Old Trails Association Will Be in Bisbee This Evening at Public Meeting

EVERYBODY IS INVITED

National highways, the advantages to a community in being located on one and especially the Old Trails road will be the subject of discussion by J. J. Kirker, national organizer of the Old Trails Road association at a meeting called to be held at the office of the Commercial club at 7:30 this evening. Mr. Kirker has organized strong units at El Paso and Douglas and is now here to organize a Bisbee unit. All who are interested in placing and keeping Bisbee on a National Ocean to Ocean highway are invited to attend this meeting and will learn much of interest relative to the movement and the bill now in congress for an appropriation of \$7,000,000 to aid the project. It is expected that the attendance will exceed the limits of the office and that an adjournment will be taken to the hotel parlor.

Yesterday morning a letter from Mr. Kirker was received by the good roads committee stating that Mr. Kirker would arrive in the afternoon and asking that a meeting be called in the evening. The time was considered short for proper notice to be given and a telephone message was sent to Douglas that a meeting would be arranged for tonight.

The National Old Trails Road is so far as this section is concerned identical with the Borderland Route. The movement has the support of the Daughters of the Revolution and other strong backing. The association has pending in congress now the bill mentioned and the various units are aiding in efforts for its passage. From Bisbee Saturday night the Commercial club sent telegrams, as it had been requested to do urging its passage. Mr. Kirker will explain the matter fully tonight. He will show that a national highway is of general advantage to every business man along its line, irrespective of whether or not he owns an automobile and especially here in Arizona and before the 1915 expositions in California. The committee in calling the meeting therefore urge business men generally, whether they have as yet awakened to the need of good roads to attend the meeting, they so stated to the Review and that it is their desire that the meeting shall not be composed merely of automobile owners but shall be a representative one. They have been informed that the organization in Douglas is nearly a hundred strong and in this district they desire to make an equally creditable showing. Each endorsement of the southerly way, as by the Old Trails association and the Transcontinental Touring club strengthens the claims of this section for such route and weakens that much the attempts of the northerly part of the state to secure the proposed highway. For these reasons the good roads enthusiasts hereabouts are expected to welcome the visitor by a general attendance at the meeting tonight.

CHARLES LOBB FUNERAL WILL BE HELD TODAY

Well Known and Highly Esteemed Miner's Death Occasioned Dismayed

"Death due to accident, caused by negligence in removing the boulder which crushed him," was the verdict rendered by the coroner's jury yesterday after investigating the death of Charles Lobb, who was killed in the Spray shaft Saturday night. Lobb was working in a drift when a boulder fell upon him, killing him instantly.

Charles Lobb was well known in this city, having resided here twelve years. He is survived by his wife, two children and two sisters, Mrs. Edward Dickinson and Mrs. Thomas Maddern. The funeral services will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Methodist church, Rev. E. G. Decker officiating. Interment will be made in Evergreen cemetery. Friends are invited to the services. The news of the tragic death of Mrs. Lobb came as a shock to the community, spreading dismay among all who knew him.

BELIEVED TO BE REBEL AGENTS

Two Brought in Yesterday by Ed Thomas and Lodged in Jail Pending Investigation

Edward Thomas, son of Constable Charles Thomas, brought to the city last night Edward Tribble and a Mexican who, are thought to have been "rustling" horses from the Boquillas Land and Cattle Co.

When discovered the men were both riding on one of the company horses. They were told to halt and both dropped off and made for the brush. They were found, however, and taken in charge by Thomas. They are believed to be members of a band that is operating in that section securing mounts for Mexican rebels. Ed Tribble was a captain in the "army" of Red Lopez, who led the attack on Agua Prieta. Lopez was later arrested on an old charge and shot. Tribble has not been active in the recent revolutionary movement as far as is known. The nerve displayed by young Thomas in landing the two Mexicans deserves much commendation for him.

It is no unusual thing for an Englishman to remain in the game fifteen years. Johnny Summers, present welterweight champion of Europe, and Owen Moran have had thirteen years of fighting and are still in fine trim. Jim Driscoll and Digger Stanley entered the ring in 1910. Freddie Welsh took up the sport in 1905, and could give Willie Ritchie a good argument today. A majority of our American boxers, on the other hand, are through after seven or eight years of the ring. Dan Nelson, who has been in the game 17 years, is the one shining exception.

Two good boxing cards, together with a fencing match for the championship of Bisbee and a wrestling exhibition, will make up the card of the weekly boxer at the Y. M. C. A., to be held tonight.

The fencing match will be between Engineer J. N. Acosta and Sr. de la Fuente. Both have been seen in action here before and have shown great skill with the foils. The winner will be accredited with the championship of the city.

The first bout of the evening will be between C. Wittig and J. McCullough. It will be in the welter weight division and promises to be a good one. It will be called at 8 o'clock and followed by one between C. Leason and C. Wittiger, in the lightweight class. The two bouts will do much to decide the final standing of the boxers. In the tournament as there will be but one more card before the finals, which will be held on March 5.
