Reply Briefs Finished.

MOOSE ENJOY GOOD EVENING OF SPORT

Mixed Therewith Were Specialties by Popular Entertainers of City

By far the cleanest and cleverest boxing bout ever pulled off in this city, was that between Kid Williams and Jack Whittaker at the Moose hall Sunday night. The bout was the closing feature of an evening of splendid entertainment in celebration of ending of the pool and billiard tournament running the past four weeks.

Messrs. Piper and Scott gave mandolin and guitar duets during the evening and solos were well received. H. C. Jordan gave several excellent flute solos. E. Temby and C. Wittig gave humorous and soulful violin selections. The ever popular Glenn Henry, loaned by the Royal theater, rendered several well received ballads. Bernard Carruthers recited the pathetic last act from the Girl of the Golden West. He was a big hit.

The concluding feature was the featherweight three round bout between Kid Williams and Jack Whittaker. Both men were in the pink of condition, weighing in at 124 ring-side. They took their corners at 10 o'clock. Whittaker was seconded by Zigler and Williams by Kelley. Bernard Carruthers was referee. Time called at 10:10. The fight by rounds was:

Round 1. Both men spar. Williams leads with swing to body. Whittaker counters with right to head, upper cut with left to head. Williams swings with right and left to body. Right to head went wild. Whittaker upper cuts to face and right to Kidneys. Clinch at gong. Round even.

Round 2. Whittaker rushes with straight right to face. And left to body. Right to head. Williams returns with strong right to face and left to body. Whittaker lands right, to head and left to kidneys. Spar at gong. Round even.

Round 3. Williams tries right for head, goes wild. Whittaker returns with right and left to body, repeats same. Williams swings left to jaw. Whittaker returned with terrific right to jaw. Williams jabs right to head. Clinch. They break. Whittaker sends good left and right to body. Clinch. Williams ends right to body. Whittaker swings right as gong sounds Whittaker's round by a share. No decision.

Although it was intended to present the winners with their cups Sunday night only V. M. Johnson finished. He won first in the billiard tournament. It is expected that the remainder of the playing will be finished during the week.
