WESTGARD PARTY BOOSTS ROUTE

Having covered nearly 15,000 miles of the 18,000 miles which he expects to log and map, A. L. Westgard, known as the man of many miles vice president and director of the Transcontinental highways of the National Highways Association, arrives here last night from Tucson. He is accompanied by Mrs. Westgard and Harry J. Orr, his driver. This morning the party will leave for Douglas. They expect to make Lordsburg tomorrow night on the way to El Paso. My present tour is of great importance to Arizona," Mr. Westgard said last night. "These routes of our proposed system of national highways cross this state. We have given our official approval to the Overland route, which passes through Douglas, Bisbee, Tombstone, Tucson, Florence, Mesa, Phoenix, Buckeye, Arlington, Agua Caliente and Yuma. Another route included in our system enters Arizona near Magdalena, New Mexico and passes down through Springerville and Rico to Globe, connecting with the Borderland at Phoenix. Still another crosses the northern part of the state keeping pretty close to the Santa Fe railroad track.

A bill is now pending in congress providing for the establishment of a national highways commission. At our members and officers are working earnestly for the passage of that bill. The work that I am now doing is to gather data regarding the proposed national highways system which connects every commercial center of importance and every state capital. When the commission begins work it will not have to spend years in making preliminary surveys and collecting information. We will have all the necessary data ready to turn right over, and thus the completion of the system will be brought years nearer.

"On my present trip I hope to bring Governor Hunt of Arizona and Governor McDonald of New Mexico together somewhere along the Borderland route. A conference between them and myself might result in great benefit to both states. Some times two adjoining states have excellent road systems mapped out, but their roads do not connect with each other at the intervening boundary. I think that the tentatively mapped systems of Arizona and New Mexico connect perfectly, but still I believe that it would be wise for the governors and the state engineers to have a general conference."

Mr. Westgard said that the Borderland route would be continued by the association direct to Galveston on account of the winter traffic coming from New York and other eastern cities with their cars by coast to that point and then overland. He said it the only route that can be traveled the year round to the coast, the other routes having stretches that are closed certain parts of the year either by snow or floods.

WOULD INSTALL SAFETY GASOLINE TANKS

G. H. Reuben is here from Phoenix in an endeavor to secure contract for the placing of sunken gasoline tanks in the garages of the district. He represents the S. S. Bowers storage and distributing system of San Francisco, which makes a specialty of the Bowers gasoline tanks. These are placed underground. A stand pipe arrangement above the sidewalk surface feeds the gasoline through a pump and measuring device. Machine tanks are filled direct from these in the street. When the pump is not in operation the gasoline is held below the surface of the ground and is absolutely cut off from possible connection of ignition from above. The system is compelled by law in many states while most cities throughout the country require under city ordinance the protection it gives from explosions and fires. Danger from the latter causes always possible wherever gasoline is kept, is reduced to the minimum. Mr. Reuben is in hope that on the present trip he will be able to demonstrate the very decided advisability of using the underground storage system and make home installations. Gasoline available at the curb would be a decided convenience during the auto races as well as to auto drivers at all times.

The number taking advantage of this privilege and traveling by Bisbee and Douglas is constantly increasing and will undoubtedly continue to do so.

"I would not have missed it for any thing," Mr. Donovan declared enthusiastically before leaving for Douglas last evening to spend the night. "The opportunity to stop in this big mining city and then to see the big smelting city of the Southwest, on the way to the coast, instead of filling in the time looking at the desert from a Pullman that has become a tiresome cage after three days of continuous travel, is certainly the rarest treat of a trip west from the Atlantic coast and I am sure that stopovers in Bisbee and Douglas are going to become very popular. The railroad and the Chambers of Commerce of the towns ought to make a feature of it and it is an opportunity for every one of our people to do some good boosting by letting friends in the east know through correspondence that they can not stop off here for a while, pleasantly and profitably breaking trips either going west or east."
