

WAR BULLETINS

CAMPAIGN FOR RECRUITS
LONDON, (Sunday) Aug. 30.—Field Marshal Roberts, while addressing a meeting last night to obtain recruits for the British army, declared the country was in great danger.

"There is no use mincing words," he said, "defeat by Germany would mean ruin, shame and slavery."

"Our soldiers are fighting bravely," said Lord Roberts, "but they are in a minority. It is the duty of every able-bodied man to see that the army is maintained at its full strength. Women must stand in the light of their son's and husband's duty."

RUSH TOWARD PRUSSIA
LONDON, Aug. 29.—A hundred and sixty railway trains loaded with German troops have passed through Belgium from the southwest toward the northeast according to an Antwerp dispatch to Reuters. This, it is added, indicates that the Germans are sending troops back on account of the Russian advance.

The German force at Brussels has been reduced to a minimum. These 160 trains which passed through last night, the dispatch continues, are transporting one army corps with full equipment. The report adds:

"It would appear that the rapid advance of Russians is compelling the Germans to withdraw troops from the line at Meuse."

REFUSES JAP OFFER
PEKIN, Aug. 29.—It is understood the Chinese government will refuse Japan's offer to suppress any disorders that may occur in China during the European war. The government, it is said, believes itself capable of putting down any purely internal uprising.

The cable between Shanghai and Tientsin has been cut and it is stated the entire German far eastern fleet is inside the harbor at Tientsin. And that Germans are placing floating mines outside the harbor entrance.

GERMANS IN TURKEY
LONDON, Aug. 29.—A correspondent of the Reuter Telegram at Athens says: "According to semi-official statements news has been received from trustworthy sources at Constantinople that 200 German officers and others, as well as a quantity of ammunition, passed through Bulgaria Friday in a special train on the way to Constantinople."

DESTROY THE BRIDGES
AMSTERDAM, (Sunday) Aug. 30.—A despatch to the Allgemeine Handelszeitung from Turnhout, Belgium, says: "The Germans have blown up the railway bridges on the line between Moll, a village 31 miles east of Antwerp, and Munchen-Gladbach, in Rhenish Prussia."

SAME AS YESTERDAY
LONDON, Aug. 28.—The French embassy has received telegram describing the situation on the French front from Soume to Vorges as the same today as it was yesterday.

The telegram adds the Germans seem to have slackened their march and from the evidence of the German prisoners gravity, their losses are confirmed.

BELGIANS SEND MINISTERS
LONDON, Aug. 29.—A despatch to the Reuter Telegram from Ostend says a commission of ministers has left for the United States. The ministers are charged with a mission to Wilson, to whom they will deliver a document from the Belgian government relating to alleged violations of international law conventions by Germany, and solicit action by the American government.

EMPEROR NOT ILL
VIENNA (via Rome and Paris) Aug. 29.—It is learned from a reliable source that the health of Emperor Francis Joseph is perfectly satisfactory, and that he has been quite well since the war began.

MAYTORENA IS NOW SUPREME "HOMBRE" IN STATE OF SONORA

Recognized As Supreme Civil and Military Governor Following the Conference Between Villa, Obregon and the Combatants

NOGALES, Aug. 29.—Governor Maytorena is recognized as supreme civil and military ruler of Sonora tonight following an all day conference between Villa and Obregon and representatives of the warring factions in the state.

Villa and Obregon will escort Maytorena to Hermosillo and install him in office.

GERMAN AMBASSADOR SAYS ENGLISH SHIPS VICTORY NOT GREAT

Has Not Received Confirmation of Newspaper Accounts of the Naval Engagement in Which Several German Ships Sunk

NEW YORK, Aug. 29.—Count von Bernstorff, the German ambassador to the United States announced he had received no confirmation from his government of the destruction of German cruisers in the North Sea by the British fleet but he assumed the newspaper accounts are correct.

"I do not account it in any sense a great naval battle," he said. "It seems that the entire British fleet attacked and sunk a few German ships doing outpost duty."

SWEEDISH MINISTER SAYS HIS COUNTRY IS NOT MOBILIZING

Has Received No Official Word of Any Activities of the Army—May Be Preparing to Maintain Peace Admits As Opinion

BAR HARBOR, Me., Aug. 29.—W. F. A. Ewagren, Swedish minister to the United States says tonight that he has not heard officially of an order to mobilize the Swedish army, reported from New York. He said he knew of no grave political movement in Sweden and expressed the opinion that if the army has been ordered to mobilize, it is to preserve neutrality.

WARING POWERS HAVE RICH POSSESSIONS AT STAKE IN AFRICA

France Holds Largest Territory and England Is Next, the Latter Having More Than Forty-Nine Million People in Domain

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—The African possessions and protectorates of the European powers now at war are more than three times as large as continental United States. They are more than three times as large as all of Europe now plunged in war, and are eleven times larger than England, France, Germany and Belgium, which control them, says the National Geographic Society at Washington, D. C. in a statement issued today. They occupy 8,677,541 of Africa's 11,513,000 square miles.

"The largest individual holder of African territory is France, with 3,812,000 square miles, more than a million and a half of which is the Sahara Desert," says the Society's statement. "England controls 2,618,245 square miles; Belgium, with Belgian Congo as its sole possession, 892,000 square miles, and Germany, 1,935,084 square miles. These figures make surprising contrasts with those of the European holders of these countries. European France consists of 207,054 square miles; England, 121,291 square miles; Belgium, 11,272 square miles, and Germany, 208,780 square miles.

"England leads in the population of her African dependencies, with a total of 49,458,506 inhabitants, more than two million of whom are Europeans. The bulk of her white population is in the Union of South Africa, which consists of Good Hope, Natal, the Transvaal and Orange Free State, and in which dwell 1,500,000 'foreigners.' There are approximately 49,000,000 people living in French African possessions, more than a million of whom are white. The center of France's white population is Algeria, where nearly 800,000 Europeans and 5,000,000 natives live. There are 15,000,000 people in Belgium Congo, 5,495 of whom are white, and 12,265,500 German subjects in her dependencies, of whom nearly 20,000 are Europeans. Thirteen thousand of these live in German Southwest Africa.

"The natural resources of many of these African possessions are among the richest in the world. The Union of South Africa, under British control, exported in 1910 \$154,502,000 in gold and \$40,199,000 in diamonds. The imports and exports of Algeria, a French possession, exceeded \$235,000,000 in 1912. Belgian Congo's exports now pass the \$15,000,000 mark annually, while Germany's colonies are sending to other countries about \$25,000,000 worth of produce annually.

"The principal British possessions in Africa are East Africa, Protectorate, Bechuanaland, Rhodesia, the Union of South Africa, Northern and Southern Nigeria, Gold Coast, Uganda Protectorate, Somaliland, and Nyaland. France numbers among her possessions Algeria, Tunis, Ivory Coast, Dahomey, Congo, Madagascar, Senegal and the Somali Coast. Germany controls Togo, Kamerun, German South-West Africa and German East Africa."

Everybody's Admits the Injustice of Its Article Concerning Distinguished Arizonan and Salt River Valley Project—Regrets

In the current issue of Everybody's Magazine appears the following statement which will be of interest to the many friends of Judge Richard E. Sloan, throughout Arizona:

"Everybody's Magazine has made an error and done an injustice. In the issue for April, 1913, we published an extended article entitled 'Erico Sloan, Lawbreaker.' It was an account of the circumstances under which the United States Reclamation Service has been developing the irrigation of arid districts in the Southwest, with particular attention to the Salt River Valley project in Arizona, and the distribution of power and water from the great Roosevelt Dam. The contract between the Reclamation Service and the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, by which electric power was sold for distribution in Phoenix, was the subject of severe comment.

"In certain paragraphs of this article Hon. Richard E. Sloan was criticized in the statement of facts and in deductions therefrom. It was suggested that as Territorial Governor of Arizona Mr. Sloan had an influential part in sanctioning the contract in question; that as counsel for the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association he had failed to render undivided and faithful service in passing upon the contract; and that later as Federal judge of that district (a position which he held by appointment of President Taft) he might have occasion to
