

REFORMS DEMANDED TO SECURE PROPER USE OF INITIATIVE

PHOENIX, Feb. 2.—Amendment of the election laws to prevent fraud, reduction of fees charged by the state for public services and the general distribution of new laws in printed form to the people of the state are recommended by Secretary of State...

Under the existing law requiring for signatures to petitions for initiative or referendum measures, Secretary Osburn states that it is impossible to ascertain whether or not the signers are qualified electors...

That the charges prescribed by law for the copying of laws and performing other services is entirely too high and in some cases exorbitant is the statement of the secretary of state...

That the initiative measures were expensive as well as numerous at the last election and bid fair to become even more so is shown in the report. In 192 the publicity pamphlet contained only 27 pages and was mailed to only some 20,000 persons...

The records of the secretary of state show that Governor Hunt has granted 195 communications of sentence, five full and unconditional pardons, 29 reductions to citizenship, and has issued five proclamations of reprieve...

FLOOD WATER FAST FILLING ROOSEVELT

FOOT A DAY WILL BE ADDED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS

ROOSEVELT DAM, Feb. 2.—Rapidly falling temperature in the high mountain valleys, whence comes the water for the reservoir, cut down the inflow from the rainstorms of Friday...

Two and a half feet of water poured over the intake dam at 6 o'clock p. m. and the flood showed little sign of decreasing during the night.

The prediction of an average of about a foot a day to the elevation of the reservoir for the next two weeks seems to have been well founded. Not all the water resulting from the storm can be measured at the dam yet, for a large part of it remains on the watershed in the form of snow and ice.

The number of automobiles in the state increased during 1914 by 312 or 61 per cent. Receipts for license tags for the year amounted to \$29,863 and from motorcycle fees \$12,287.

JUAREZ MAKES PLANS AS IF PREPARING TO STAGE REAL FIGHT

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—Plans for the Johnson-Willard championship battle at Juarez, Mexico, on March 6 are rapidly being completed. The promoters have established permanent quarters at El Paso, just across the international boundary, and have mapped out a long list of details which must be arranged before the principals enter the ring.

Willard will do his conditioning in the suburbs of El Paso where the summer home of one of the leading citizens has been placed at his disposal. Located on one of the principal boulevards of the city it will be easy of access and the surrounding grounds and stables afford excellent facilities for both indoor and outdoor work.

Both pugilists are planning to arrive at the training camps early next month in order that they may become accustomed to the rarefied atmosphere. Both El Paso and Juarez have an altitude of close to 4000 feet and training conditions are vastly different from those prevailing at lower levels.

This was brought out sharply in the Johnson-Jeffries contest in 1910. After spending some weeks in conditioning at close to sea level near San Francisco, the camps were shifted to Reno, the governor ordered the pugilist out of California. The change to the Nevada town at an altitude of approximately 4500 feet set back the training for fully a week while principals and helpers were adapting themselves to the higher air.

Under the present schedule the boxers will have from four to five weeks in which to prepare for the contest, which is none too long under the circumstances. Willard is expected to start his serious work at El Paso on or about February 1, and Johnson is due to arrive at Juarez about three days later. By that date the arrangements for staging the battle will have been completed. Mater-
