PARIS, April 10.--Paris waiters are up in arms against a proposition to extend the employment of women in restaurants and cafes. Heretofore women have been admitted to a certain class of popular priced restaurants and to recently established bars, only. The mobilization took a great many waiters and it was suggested their places might be taken advantageously by women. The waiters hold that there is no necessity for it as business is so much reduced. They fear the introduction of women now would develop serious labor conflicts after the war.
