

METAL SHARES HAVE MODERATE MOVEMENT ON STOCK EXCHANGE

Adjudication of Arabic Episode Settles Market; Metal Shares Fairly Active; Tennessee Copper Makes Overnight Gain.

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Statements from official sources that the Arabic episode will be adjusted and that no further friction will be between this country and Germany for fifteen days was the basis for another moderate movement. Trading was relatively quiet, except for the opening and final but what lacked activity was an offset of greater breadth.

Metal stocks, so long dormant, were in general demand, and their strength was associated with a better market abroad, copper futures registering an advance of three pounds sterling per ton in London. Tennessee Copper was the sensational feature in that group rising by leaps and bounds, just before the closing, to 55 a new high record, and an overnight gain of eleven and a fourth. A week ago it closed at 47 1/2. Shares of the various steel and iron companies made additional gains in another advance in certain manufactured shapes, particularly plates and bars. Foreign buying was again the factor in this industry and was more decided for the British and French accounts. United States Steel was under pressure, however, despite the opening gains of a point in common, and proffered at 76 and 112 3/8. Common reacted later to 75 1/8 and closed at 75 3/4, with sales at 750,000. Total sales were 720,000.

The critical state of the foreign exchange situation was exemplified by renewed weakness for reiterations on London, Paris and Rome. Demand for sterling fell to a new low rate of 4.64. French credits were offered at 9.85 1/2. Lires declined three cents to 6.47 1/2. Marks alone were firm at 81 5/8. The spot value negotiated \$2.620.000.

DEFEND LYNCHING, PARDONS, PAROLES BEFORE GOVERNORS

Former Governor Cole Blease, of South Carolina, Speaks Belief in Paroles and Pardons for Prisoners of State.

BOSTON, Aug. 26.—A demonstration of preparedness in the active military service of the Massachusetts quota of the National Guard was given the visiting governors and a great throng of citizens in a parade of the state militia yesterday.

BOSTON, Aug. 26.—Former Governor Cole Blease of South Carolina, who by exercising his power of parole and pardon practically emptied the prisons of his state, defended lynching, in some instances, as a protection in civilization; denounced "third degree" methods of extracting from prisoners methods of extracting from prisoners and spoke for a liberal parole system.

"Whether he was murdered or whether he really committed suicide I do not know; but this I do know, that the suicide of any man would hardly be unnatural under such circumstances and the treatment accorded him, before conviction, would have been a disgrace to our civilization even had it occurred even after he had been tried and sentenced.

"In the south the lynching of a man for the unmentionable crime is a protection to our civilization, while the 'third degree' violates the letter of the constitution in its most vital points."

GREAT ARRAY OF OLD TIME TOMBSTONERS AT SUPERIOR COURT

TOMBSTONE, Aug. 26 (Special)—It is doubtful if there will ever be another case tried in Cochise County that will be the means of bringing together as witnesses so many old timers of the county and of the Warren and Tombstone-Mining Districts as has the Cunningham-Costello case that is now on trial.
