WITHDRAWS FROM CASE. WINNEPEG, Sept. 21.—E. H. Johnson, counsel for the defense, created a surprise this afternoon by withdrawing from the case of Sir Rodman Robinson and three other former cabinet ministers charged with conspiring to defraud the province in connection with the erection of parliament buildings.
