**FEDERAL GAME LAW SUPERCEDES STATE**

**Conflict of Authority May Arise as Result of Clash Between the Federal and State Statutes.**

PHOENIX, Jan. 4.—From information on the back of the 1916 hunting license, issued by the state game warden's office, it is apparent that both state and federal laws are to be enforced.

The license card says: "Where state and federal laws conflict, the federal law governs." If the federal law is declared constitutional by the United States supreme court, in the case of U. S. vs. Shaver appeal from Arkansas, heard last October, it will nearly wipe out the Arizona game laws, and leave the state game warden but little to do, according to a Phoenix attorney, who says:

"Of course, no one will contend for a minute that if the federal game law is constitutional, that any one can take certain parts of that law and consider them in force, and certain parts of the Arizona game law and

prosecute under them. The whole or none of the federal law will be enforced.

"If the federal law is enforced it entirely takes charge of the following game, over which the state can assume no jurisdiction whatever: "Paragraph one, Act of Congress, approved March 4, 1913.)

"All wild geese, wild swans, wild ducks, snipe, plover, woodcock, rail, wild pigeons and all other migratory game and insectivorous birds which in their northern and southern migrations pass through or do not remain permanently the entire year within the borders of any state or territory, shall hereafter be deemed to be within the custody and protection of the government of the United States, and shall not be destroyed or taken contrary to regulations hereinafter provided therefor."

"No state license would be required or could be collected for the killing of any of the above mentioned game birds, and there is no limit to the number one hunter may kill in one day, nor the size of gun which may be used. The federal law places no close season on doves or white-wings, so that they might be killed at any season, anywhere, and in any quantity."

"The state law would then apply on deer, turkey, quail and fish only, and state license would of course have to be obtained in order to take these."

**ARGUES FOR DEFENSE.**

NEW YORK, January 4.—"In the solemn judgment of William Howard Taft, white president and his attorney general, Wickersham, there has been no violation of the Sherman law, "by the New Haven," was presented in the jury trial of the eleven former directors as a reason for the acquittal of the defendants. It was in the plea of the attorney summing up the defense. It was based on the fact that Wickersham in 1909 withdrew the Sherman dissolution suit against the New Haven after its acquisition of the Boston and Maine.

**WILLING TO REFER MATTER.**

LONDON, January 4.—The British statement says: "Sir Edward Grey answered the Germans' complaint through the American embassies regarding the destruction of the German submarine and crew off the coast of Ireland by the British auxiliary cruiser Baralong, by merely referring to the various German outrages. Grey offers to submit such incidents, including the Baralong case to an impartial tribunal composed of say, officer of the United States navy."

**SUPERVISORS HOLD REGULAR MEETING AT THE COUNTY SEAT**

MERCHANTS MUST HAVE SIGNED ORDER BEFORE SELLING GOODS TO COUNTY—BIDS OPENED AND MORE ORDERED ADVERTISED.

TOMBSTONE, Jan. 4.—(Special)—The board of supervisors was in regular session yesterday and disposed of considerable business. Besides awarding the contracts for furnishing the supplies, they audited the usual monthly claims of the county and discussed the various industries of the county and plans for the present year.

The clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for the furnishing of the printing supplies and the publishing of the minutes and advertisements for the coming year. The bids will be opened on the first Monday in February.

The clerk was instructed to inform all of the merchants of the county not to furnish any supplies whatever that are chargeable to the county, without the presentation, at the time, of an order or a requisition signed by a member of the board of supervisors, the clerk or the county engineer. The board will hereafter refuse to allow any claim that is filed for supplies furnished that is not accompanied by the order given at the time. During the past few months supplies have been purchased without the authority of the board and in order to keep a check on all of this business the board has issued that order. Merchants throughout the county should be governed accordingly or are liable to find themselves suffering from a loss thereby.

The bid of Henry Pyeatt for the Willcox high school bonds of \$6,100 was accepted, being a premium of \$100.

The bid of Causey-Foster Co. of Denver was accepted for the Webb school district bonds for \$2,537, being a premium of \$27.00.

The annual report of the county assessor, covering the collection for school taxes, shows that during the year there was collected by that office \$19,332.00 which is an increase over the year previous.

The annual reports of the other offices on account of the unusual amount of business will not be ready before the middle of the present month. The reports will show an excellent condition of the affairs of the county and that in most instances there was vast increase in the amount of business transacted.

The report of the board is now being prepared by A. C. Karzer and will be a lengthy one and will be a general review of the expenditures of the county as well as the receipts and will be of general interest to the citizens and tax payers of the county.

A special meeting of the board will be held on Saturday next, when business connected with the selection of state lands will be taken up.

Chairman Sparks expects to leave shortly on a visit to his mother and old home in Idaho and will be gone for a month or six weeks.

**BRYAN PROTESTS.**

NEW YORK, January 4.—William Jennings Bryan, vigorously protested against the law in New York state because he was required to come here of his own expense in a libel suit.

"I am here under duress," Bryan declared, "because it is the only way to avoid contempt proceedings."

The suit is the outgrowth of a statement in a Greek newspaper that the plaintiff, Petros Tatanis, wrote or caused to be written, in a letter with a view to causing ill feeling between Mr. Bryan, when Secretary of State, and the former Greek Premier Schlemmann.

**QUIET AT YOUNGSTOWN.**

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio, Jan. 4.—Quiet prevailed tonight in the vicinity of the various mills of the Republic Iron and Steel company, where more than 600 laborers are striking for higher wages.

The strikers' ranks were augmented by the addition of 300 from Brown Bonnell plant, the open hearth department at Hazelton. Strike leaders claim that more than 3000 are affected and virtually all work of the company it a standstill. The police arrested nine strikers and sympathizers around the mills.

**FEW LEGISLATORS ON HAND.**
