

CANANEA NEWS NOTES

The Aurora Consolidated Copper Co. has bonded its properties in the Santa Cruz country to a syndicate of California capitalists. Its holdings are among the most valuable in the district and they will probably soon take their place in the ranks of the heavy shippers.

Owing to the late storm telegraphic communication with Guaymas and Hermosillo, the capital of the state, has been interrupted. Work on the re-opening of the line is being rapidly pushed forward.

Cananeans are anxiously awaiting a visit from their governor, General P. Elias Calles, who is contemplating a tour of inspection through the northern part of the state.

A bowling tournament will be held in the alleys of the Cananea Recreation Hall, commencing February 14. Suitable prizes will be awarded to winners and all the teams in the city have signified their desire to enter. Rudolph Weiner and Fred Ryan were among the many traveling men visiting the district this week.

The Little Joe mine has been leased to a local company. It is located in the Mariquita mountains. Shipments from this property run wall in copper, silver and lead values.

W. D. Gooch has returned from a purchasing trip through the southern part of the state and reports conditions as fast improving. The American schools of Cananea will shortly re-open and a large enrollment is anticipated. Capable instructors have been secured from the United States.

Dr. White, of the 4-C hospital corps, has resigned to accept a position with a large smelting concern in Bolivia, after spending the Mardi-Gras week in New Orleans, the doctor, accompanied by his estimable wife and family, will sail from New York.

Mr. R. A. Armstrong, for the past two years in charge of the mercantile department of the 4-C, has tendered his resignation to take effect the first of March, having accepted a similar position with a large corporation in Arizona. During his short time in Cananea Mr. Armstrong has endeared himself to all residents of this section who will regret to see him depart.

Mr. Charles Wiswall, manager of the Cananea Cattle Co., is expected to return in a few days from an extensive trip through the interior of the republic.

Fred Pheby and associates have denounced a rich copper-silver property in the Sierra Azul. They expect to begin shipments in the near future.

The recent heavy rains have sent many miners into the Bacochi gold field where for many years hundreds have obtained a livelihood washing gold in these rich placers.

A twice-a-week service has been established between Cananea and towns lying the Sonora river.

The demand for silver pesos throughout the state has sent the prices upwards. We look to see the peso quoted shortly at 50 cents gold.

Mr. J. A. Hunter, of Socorro, N. M., has been appointed chief chemist of the Calumet-Sonora Mining company.

NEGRO TROOPERS ARE HELD ON CHARGE OF ENTERING WAREHOUSE

Interested Court Room Listens to Conflicting Evidence as Given by Soldiers of 10th Cavalry.

Whisky and negro troopers (four of them—maybe more—mixed) up with the government yesterday afternoon and the fracas resulted in a victory for the United States. The four were held to the United States grand jury on the charge of breaking into a bonded warehouse on \$350 bail each. They remained in custody of James McDonald, deputy marshal.

"All ah kno' 'bout this business," said one James A. Storey, "Is dat a littl' white detectiv' told me as he wanted some evidence. Ah wuz workin' de 'dobe pit and seed a couple o' boys comin' 'long wit' an arm load of sumptin'. It had a jingl' like whiske' Ah wuz doin' some secret work for dis officer and dat's all Ah knows."

Storey was talking to Assistant United States Attorney William J. Bryan, Jr., and to United States Commissioner Jared D. Taylor. Incidentally he was the author of considerable mirth for a small room full of United States officials and several other defendants in the same case.

Storey appeared to be afflicted with a mild case of the hook worm. It was at least a state of ennui he was in and when he told the United States Attorney that he was at "Miss Clara's place in Naco, Arizona, watchin' some of the boys mixin' som' of dis here egg-nogg on Wednesday night," while in reality he was replying in the Bisbee jail, naturally the lawyer became inquisitive.

Storey, with Henry Green, Frank Hutchinson and John Kellog, were the defendants. Green and Hutchinson acknowledged entering the bonded warehouse on the night of January 25 and extracting therefrom a goodly supply of Old Taylor whiskey, in quarts. Kellog, in whose bed at the army camp was found two pints of Blue Grass whiskey, stoutly maintained that Green had given him the liquor. This Green as stoutly denied. He had Hutchinson for corroborative testimony and the two men agreed on this detail. But otherwise the four prisoners were about as agreeable as a French major and German Colonel might be at a Belgian banquet.

Each had more or less of a statement to make. Each laid most of the blame on someone else. All were teetotalers, or nearly so, and Lieutenant Henry H. Adair, of the Tenth Cavalry, smiled through it all.

The liquor is that which was placed in the bonded warehouse at the time Lieut. Col. Cardenas, on July 19, 1915, drove the Matzenalistas out of Naco, Sonora, and broke up all of the liquor to be had on the Mexican side of the line. That the negro troopers have been having considerable of a time for the past six weeks or so is vouched for by the customs officials.

The warehouse, in which the liquor was stored, has been entered no less than seven times. The last robbery occurred, to the best of the knowledge of the officers, on January 26. Since that time the officers have been making every effort to break up the activities of the liquor-hungry soldiers. Judging from the number in jail in Bisbee and in Lowell and the effect that action is having on the other men in the camp at Naco, it would appear as though the storeroom is safe for some weeks to come.

AIREDALE TERRIERS KILL WILD BOAR IN TERRIFIC BATTLE

Warren District Hunters Witness Thrilling Combat when their Four Dogs Join in Death Combat.

One of the most thrilling adventures of the present hunting season was reported yesterday by George Pepper and U. S. Ratteree, owners of four Airedale rated as among the best in the Southwest. Pepper and Ratteree set forth Sunday with their terriers to hunt javalinee, or wild hogs, in the Swisshells.

Arriving in the hunting grounds, they found ample evidence of the presence of the game they sought but the hogs were elusive and no opportunity was had for some time. While the terriers were ranging through the thickets, Pepper's registered Kinsella Peggy drove up a big gray boar. As she gave tongue the other terriers joined her.

The boar tried in vain to evade pursuit but finding it was useless to shake off the terriers, he made for a gully and turned to give battle. Peggy's son, owned by Ratteree and less than two years old, rushed in ahead of the other terriers. The boar sunk his tusk through the dog's jaw but next moment Peggy had him by the throat and the Ratteree dog drew out. The other two terriers joined in the battle and when Pepper and Ratteree reached the scene the struggle was raging furiously. They tried to seize a chance to shoot the boar but the swiftness of the terriers as they fought made such action impossible without peril to Peggy and her mates.
