



EL PASO, May 15.—Juan N. Medina, former mayor of Juarez, and later Villa commander at Torreón, was arrested here late tonight on the technical charge of vagrancy. He says he withdrew from the Villa army after the battle of Agua Prieta last December. According to the police, Medina will be released and sent away from the border.
