ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF "PURITY DRUG COMPANY" which were filed in the office of said Arizona Corporation Commission on the 22nd day of June A. D. 1916, at 10:00 o'clock a. m., as provided by law.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF "PURITY DRUG COMPANY." KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned have voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Arizona.

AND WE HEREBY CERTIFY AS FOLLOWS: The name of the corporation shall be "Purity Drug Company" and its principal place of business shall be at Lowell, Cochise County, State of Arizona.

I. The names, residences and post-office addresses of the incorporators are as follows: Ross H. Cunningham, whose residence is in Warren, Cochise County, Arizona, and whose post-office address is Lowell, Arizona; Phil E. Tovrea, whose residence is in Warren, Arizona, and whose post-office address is Bisbee, Arizona; and Alexander Murry, whose residence is in Warren, Arizona, and whose post-office address is Bisbee, Arizona.

II. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation is as follows: (1) to engage in, carry on and conduct a general drug and drug store business; (2) to fill and compound prescriptions, to deal in, compound, manufacture, mix, buy, sell, vend, and dispose of drugs, chemicals and medicines, patent or otherwise; to buy, sell dispose of and deal in cameras and all manner of photographic goods and supplies, toilet articles, hardware, surgical supplies and implements, cigars, cigarettes and tobaccos, all classes of sundries, and all other sorts and kinds of goods, wares, and merchandise, pertaining to and commonly sold or vendible in or about drug stores; to manufacture, buy, and sell candies, confectionery, soda water and any and all non-alcoholic beverages and drinks that may lawfully be manufactured, bought or sold; and to do any and all classes of business in any way connected with or appertaining to the drug business; (3) to buy, sell, rent, lease, mortgage, and control real property; (4) to acquire, hold, own, pledge and sell the stocks or shares of other corporations; (5) to issue, acquire, take hold, pledge, and sell promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and obligations of every sort and character, provided that no obligation of any character, shall be issued by this corporation in excess of the liability of the company as herein set forth and as provided by law; (6) to enter into contracts of all sorts, pertaining to said drug business, to lend or borrow money and take or give security for the payment thereof; (7) to do any and all things which a natural person might and could do in the matter of the transacting of the business of the corporation and in the promotion and management of its interests.

III. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, which shall be divided into One Hundred (100) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars per share; which shares shall be and must be paid up at the date of the issuing thereof, and shall be forever non-assessable; but such stock may be paid for in money, services, property, rights, easements, privileges or anything of value, and the judgment of the board of directors shall be forever conclusive, both as to actual value of the said stock and the consideration paid therefor, in the absence of fraud or any collusive agreement.

IV. The time for the commencement of this corporation shall be when these

The corporation shall terminate twenty-five years from the said date, but it may be renewed from time to time, for periods not exceeding twenty-five years, upon the taking of the steps prescribed by law for such renewal or renewals.

V. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of three directors, but the number constituting the board of directors may be increased or diminished by the vote of the stockholders at any annual meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose.

The first board of directors shall be elected at the first annual meeting of the stockholders of the corporation, which shall be held at the principal place of business of the corporation, at Lowell, Cochise County, Arizona, on the first Monday in August, 1916, and the members of such board of directors shall be elected annually thereafter at such annual meeting, to be held on the first Monday in August of each year.

The officers of the corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and the latter two offices may be held by the same person.

All vacancies in office may be filled by the board of directors, and those elected thereto shall hold office until the next annual meeting.

Those who shall serve as the board of directors until the first annual meeting shall be Phil E. Tovrea, Alexander Murry, and Ross H. Cunningham; and the other officers to be elected shall be Phil E. Tovrea, President; Alexander Murry, Vice-President; and Ross H. Cunningham, Secretary and Treasurer.

VI. The highest amount of indebtedness of liability, direct or contingent, to which this corporation shall at any time subject itself, shall, in no case, be more than Six Thousand, Six Hundred, sixty-six and 66/100 (\$6666.66) Dollars.

VII. The private property of the stockholders of this corporation is hereby expressly made and declared exempt from all liability for the corporation debts.
