KALAMAZOO TURF CLOSES WITH BIG 2:06 TROT CARD

Lindsay Cops \$2000 Railway Company Stakes in 2:08 1/4. Bookkeeping Used to Pick Winner.

KALAMAZOO, Mich., Aug. 4.—The local grand circuit meeting ended today with three events on the card. The 2:06 trot which originally had some of the fastest horses in the light harness world entered, was called off because of insufficient starters.

The feature of the racing today was the Michigan Railway Company's \$2,000 purse, raced on the three heat system and for trotters which had never won more than \$2,000 nor had a race record faster than 2:14. The winner of the race was the horse which showed had won the most money, and when the bookkeeping was completed it was found the honor had fallen to Lindsay, driven by Lon McDonald, with \$600 to his credit. Brisac was second with \$550 and Grand Chimes third with \$380. The best time for the race was 2:08 1/4. Valentine uncovered two good pacers in Goldie C. and Miss Rejected. He went 2:08 pace with the former and the 2:19 pace with the latter.

AUTO RACERS UP PIKE'S PEAK IN NEAR ACCIDENT

Wheel Collapses on Mountain Turn, Pitching Patterson and Mulford Out; Escape Uninjured.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Aug. 4.—A. H. Patterson, an automobile race driver from Stockton, California, and Ralph Mulford, entered to start in the Pikes Peak automobile race August 10, narrowly escaped death on the highway this morning, during a practice spin over the course. Patterson was driving a special and Mulford who will drive another special car, was with him.

Near the summit, while traveling at a speed estimated by Patterson at 55 miles an hour, a front wheel broke. The car shot out to the edge of the highway and was prevented from going. The impact of the car sent the big rock to the bottom of a canyon several hundred feet below. Patterson and Mulford were thrown out of the car but not seriously injured. The car was badly damaged but it is expected that new parts ordered by wire will reach here in time for Patterson to participate in the races.

ARIZONA FIRST IN PREPAREDNESS TO MAKE WAR MUNITIONS

Full Report from Arizona, New Mexico and Texas in Headquarters. Necessity will Show Some States Ready.

Arizona, New Mexico and Texas are prepared to manufacture war munitions for the United States government whenever called upon for these munitions.

This is shown by the report of the committee on industrial preparedness of the naval consulting board, which has been given out by A. J. McQuatters, president of the Alvarado Mining company, who was one of the five chairmen of the Texas state commission for making the industrial preparedness survey of the United States.

This report shows that Arizona was the first state to make a report on the survey, which has been in progress during the past three months under the direction of Howard Coffin, of Detroit, chairman of the committee. The report from Arizona was made by Capt. John C. Greenway, general manager of the Calumet & Arizona Mining company and his report shows that all of the Arizona companies are anxious to co-operate with the government in working for industrial preparedness and are ready to manufacture munitions of war insofar as the plants are suited for this work. plan of the general committee to have manufacturers to accept minimum annual educational orders of munitions in time of peace was accepted enthusiastically by the Arizona manufacturers, the report stated. New Mexico also completed its survey on time and, with 122,000 square miles of territory, the state stands ready to co-operate in every way in the preparedness campaign, Chairman Andros, of the New Mexico committee states in his report. Texas Prepared. Texas also made great progress in the preparation of the industrial report, the statement of the committee shows. Because of its size, the state was divided into five districts, one of which was given to Mr. McQuatters, of El Paso. John B. Hawley was general chairman for Texas. One manufacturer in the state wrote that he was anxious to take trial educational orders and was "with the government in this campaign, right or wrong." To Make Munitions. The general report states that the committee will recommend a law making possible the conduct of an annual educational campaign which will include the placing of test orders for munitions of war with all of the large plants in the country. A law creating an industrial reserve so that skilled mechanics may not be called to the colors but can remain at home to turn out munitions and supplies, will also be urged by the committee. This will avoid the situation that Great Britain found herself in when she mobilized and sent to the front her skilled men in order to meet the demand for munitions and other elements.
