(Continued From Page One) to them to vote "yes" on the referendum. Mr. Hughes quoted President Lincoln's defense of the draft at the height of the Civil War and added: "As it was in the northern states in Lincoln's time, so it is with us today. Like them we are fighting for the nation. Volunteers have failed them. We, like them—unless we confess our selves degenerated—must tread the path they trod, along which they strode resistlessly to victory."

If Germany Wins The prime minister's speech, in opening the campaign for the referendum, was an impassioned one. He said in the course of it: "Can any one doubt if Germany wins, she will lay her predatory hands on this country of ours? If the allies are defeated free Australia, as we know it, will be no more. Conscripted, as it is called, against which all this wild outcry is raised, has been the law for years. It has been a plank of the labor platform. It is through that the law has been confined to compulsory military service inside the commonwealth, but the principle, compulsion, is there." The strength of the anti-conscriptors was shown a few nights later when they held a meeting on the same spot. This was as numerously attended as was the Hughes meeting.

"FOLLIES" OF WILSON ARE TOLD BY T. R.

Colonel Tells Denver He'd Have Seized German Ships When Lusitana Was Sunk, Thus Gaining Peace.

DISLIKES NOTES AND PREFERS "BIG STICK"

Roosevelt Also Wants Compulsory Universal Military Training Like Switzerland to "Eradicate Ills."

(By Review Leased Wire.) DENVER, Oct. 24.—Pleas for universal military training and criticism of President Wilson for "debauchery of the civil service" characterized the address here tonight by Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, the principal one of a trio of speeches made in the course of his one day stay in Denver. Colonel Roosevelt urged that compulsory training would redound to the benefit of the nation by increasing democracy, developing American youth physically and mentally and aiding the country's social and industrial development. His criticism of President Wilson included a declaration that the executive "had exchanged offices for political support."

Wants To Copy Swiss Colonel Roosevelt advocated repeal of the Hay military bill and the restoration of the militia to its former status. He cited Switzerland's development as an instance of what compulsory military training would do in developing a country "physically, mentally and morally."

The Colonel divided his afternoon speech, which primarily was to the women of the state, between an appeal to them to vote for Hughes and a sharp criticism of the administration's foreign and Mexican policies. He declared the passage of an amendment to the constitution of the United States, enfranchising women, was the most practical and expedient goal for the suffragists now and Mr. Hughes would maintain his announced stand in favor of this amendment.

Tough On Germany The Colonel told the crowd that if he had been president, and had sent President Wilson's "strict accountability" message to Germany, "there would have been no more ships sunk—unless there was a fight afterward. The Lusitania was sunk, with its 1394 deaths as a consequence, because other nations believed we'd be willing to be kept out of the war. If I had been president then, I'd have seized every interned German ship and then I'd have said to Germany: 'Now, we'll see, not about what you are going to give us as compensation for this, but what we are going to give you.'"

SOUTHERN PACIFIC LIFTS EMBARGO ON EASTERN FREIGHT

Effective October 26, 2000 Tied-up Cars Will Be Released and Freight on Beans Drops Ten Cents.

(By Review Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 24.—Officials of the Southern Pacific Company announced here yesterday that the embargo on eastbound freight via the company's "Sunset-Gulf" route, would be lifted on October 26, their agents having been authorized to accept on that date export shipments on through bills of lading direct to Boston, Philadelphia and Charleston. Over two thousand freight cars, the announcement says, which were tied up at Galveston early this year because of unrest along the Mexican border, were now available for use.

Lifting of the embargo, according to the company, means that such foodstuffs as beans and barley will be handled at a forty cent rate—ten cents less than the all rail rate which has been charged for these commodities since the embargo was put on.

GLYNN ARRAYS HUGHES FOR HIS INCONSISTANCIES

(By Review Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Oct. 24.—Martin H. Glynn, keynote speaker at the national Democratic convention and former governor of New York, charged Chas. E. Hughes with vacillation and inconsistency in a speech here tonight. "Between his argument why a supreme court justice should not become a candidate for president and his doubletalk to accept the nomination," said Mr. Glynn, "he veered like a tin weathercock in a storm."

"When running for governor in a state where women could not vote, he refused to see delegations seeking equal rights," continued the former Democratic governor. "As a candidate for president, he declares for woman suffrage. He talks of economy and was the most extravagant governor New York ever had. He talks of lifting the burden of taxation from the back of the poor, yet while governor, he opposed the income tax. He condemns the eight hour law as interfering with the railroads, yet he opposed the public utilities legislation."

ARGENTINE CORN SHIPPED TO U. S. IS COMPETITOR

(By Review Leased Wire.) PEORIA, Ill., Oct. 24.—Two sensations struck the board of trade here today. The first was Illinois corn selling for \$1 per bushel and the second that a large shipment of Argentine corn was enroute to a local commission house. The first shipment of Argentine corn is expected to arrive here tomorrow morning and will be offered in competition with the grain grown in Illinois. It is claimed that Argentine corn has an advantage over Illinois corn for the first four months after harvest because of its lack of moisture. Illinois corn shows 23 percent moisture up to that time, whereas Argentine corn shows about 11 percent. The difference amounts to 10 cents a bushel for manufacturing purposes in favor of the imported corn.

AMERICAN BASEBALL IN FAR OFF SAMOA.

PAGO-PAGO, American Samoa, Oct. 9.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—A baseball league of American Samoa made up of four teams representing the United States naval station, the U. S. S. Fortune, Tutilla and the Fitaftas (the navy guard) was former recently and a playing schedule of thirty games adopted. Commander John M. Hoyer, U. S. N., governor of American Samoa, will pitch the first ball in the league's opening game, scheduled for October 11.
