J. W. Scollick, for thirty-two years a scientist in Uncle Sam's employ, has restored most of the skeletons which the National Museum exhibits as samples of pre-historic mammals. In recent years the work has grown so that a separate department is devoted to each branch of bird and animal mounting. Mr. Scollick is now an osteologist and prepares all the skeletons of birds which are sent to the museum for preservation. These skeletons are used by scientists all over the world.
