That the Warren district and Douglas will receive little or nothing during the next two years in the form of road monies appears certain, according to information reaching Bisbee and following the recent caucus of the supervisors-elect and also a visit of Chairman I. C. E. Adams to the northern end of the county.

At a meeting held in Bisbee some weeks ago before which I. C. E. Adams appeared, he was told that the most needed road, from a Bisbee standpoint, was a direct connection with Gleason.

Campbell Wires Request For Higher Cotton Levy To Protect Arizona Men

PHOENIX, Dec. 22.—Governor Thomas E. Campbell telegraphed today to Senator McCumber, acting chairman of the senate finance committee, and Representative Fordney, chairman of the house ways and means committee, urging them to use their influence to secure an emergency tariff of 20 to 30 cents a pound on long staple cotton.
