Market News

**STOCK MARKET**

NEW YORK, May 12.—The stock market today experienced its fourth setback this week, further liquidation and professional selling in fairly large volume being accompanied by decidedly firmer money tendencies.

Heavy withdrawals of funds from local institutions to meet demands of the federal government doubtless occasioned the higher rate for call money, which opened at 7 per cent and remained there. Time money was unchanged, but demand for long loans and mercantile paper was light.

Foreign exchange made further substantial response to the German reparations settlement. Demand bills on London touched \$4, their best quotation since April of last year and equal or greater strength was shown by all other remittances. German marks shared in the rise and an advance of three-quarters of a cent was shown in the Greek rate.

**Industrial shares** comprising the steel, equipment and motor groups, including those whose dividend prospects were said to be rather dubious, registered extreme declines of one to three points. Some rails, which were placed in the same category, were under pressure.

Failure of the Southern railway directors to act on the preferred dividend and reductions of the common and preferred issues of Alabama Great Southern, which is under control of Southern railway, were accepted as straws showing the general trend.

Representative oils were less resilient than at any recent period. The reaction among Mexicans was especially pronounced and gave rise to further speculation respecting the productivity of those properties. Tobacco and several utilities, especially gas stocks, featured the few stable issues.

MONEY MARKETS

**ARE STIMULATED**

London, French and Belgian Exchange Reaches Record High Quotation

NEW YORK, May 12.—International money markets, as represented by foreign exchange, were further stimulated today by Germany's acceptance of the allied reparations ultimatum. Demand sterling on bills on London rose to \$4, the highest reached by that remittance since April, 1920, when they touched \$4.07.

French and Belgian francs at 8 1/2 cents showed an overnight gain of about 20 points and were at maximum levels for any period since the armistice.

The Italian lire rose 18 points; guilders, or Dutch exchange, gained eight points, and Marks, or German Bills, sold at an overnight gain of 1-10 of a cent, rising to 170.

Exchange on the several Scandinavian countries were higher by 5 to 20 points, but the greatest gain of any minor country was made by Greece, the drachma rising 75 points to 5.50.

Dealers reported the largest general operations of any day in several months. Much of the buying represented covering by shorts who had depressed the market recently on the theory Germany would fail to meet the allied demands.

Morgan Company To Offer 35 Millions

**In de Nemours Bonds**

NEW YORK, May 12.—J. P. Morgan & Company announced today purchase of \$35,000,000 10-year 7 1/2 per cent gold bonds of the E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Company, to be offered tomorrow through a countrywide banking syndicate at 100 and interest.

Proceeds will be used partly to supply funds for permanently financing the cost of the common stock of the General Motors Corporation, purchased last year, and partly for other corporate purposes. The bonds now to be issued constitute the company's only obligation of that character.
