Hon. Foster S. Dennis Dead.

Last Saturday evening, about eleven o'clock, Hon. Foster S. Dennis expired suddenly at his home in Kingman. Mr. Dennis had been ailing the past three months, but no one thought there was anything serious the matter with him until they were startled by the report of his death.

Foster Dennis came to Mohave county in the early eighties and engaged in business. He purchased the sampling works of W. J. Chamberlain and conducted the plant many years. While engaged in this business he put in the first water works, up to that time the people being served by wagon from the springs near town.

During the past twenty years he was engaged in mining and at the time of his death was the owner of valuable property. He represented Mohave county in the legislative council, was a member of the last constitutional convention and was elected to serve the county two terms as treasurer. He was a warm-hearted, wholesouled man and had many friends throughout the territory.

Funeral arrangements were in charge of the Knights of Pythias.

Tuesday afternoon the Episcopal and Pythian services were read over the bier of the deceased brother at his late home and then the funeral cortege took its way to the depot, whence the body was shipped to Sonoma, California, Mrs. Dennis and Mrs. Ernest A. Sur Whittard, accompanying the remains to the last resting place. Many friends of deceased attended the services and followed the remains to the train.

In Kingman there is sincere mourning over the untimely death of Foster Dennis, the town and county losing in him a man of worth and integrity, who was at all times ready to do everything in him for the advancement and prosperity of all.

He was a member of the order of Knights of Pythias, and also of the Masonic order, being a member of the Mystic Shrine Temple, of Los Angeles. In his death the brothers of these orders lose one of the best members and enthusiastic workers. May his sleep in the green hills of California be his best sleep.

A wife and two daughters are left to mourn his death.

Walter Brown Announces.

Liquor Licenses Not Transferrable.

Since the new liquor license law went into effect there has been various opinions entertained regarding the rights of the holder of licenses under the law. By many of the officers it was held that a license was transferrable and that the holder thereof could remove his place of business from one town to another. Recently complaint was made to the Justice of the Peace at Kingman that one Otto Cornaggia was conducting a saloon without a license at the Victor Gold mining company's camp and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Pending the service of warrant the opinion of the Attorney General of the territory was obtained which clearly set at rest the contention that a saloon license was transferrable or that business could be done under such license in any other town than the one for which said license was issued. Acting on this opinion Cornaggia was brought into court and a plea of guilty was entered. The court then fined defendant 125\$ and costs, or the alternative of taking out a license covering the period he has been doing business on the old license. But failing to obtain a license from the board of supervisors Cornaggia will have to pay the fine.

Order to Show Cause Why Decree of Distribution Should Not be Made.
