Press Letter Arizona State Bureau Of Mines.

Appointments for the Arizona State Bureau of Mines for the next year have been announced by the Board of Regents of the University of Arizona. The Bureau of Mines was authorized by the last legislature and the work starts with the fiscal year on July 1st.

Charles F. Willis, S. B. has been appointed director. Prof. Willis has been director of the University of Arizona Bureau of Mines for the past two years, the work of which has been merged into the new Bureau of Mines. Miss A. M. Heckman has been appointed secretary, having held the same position with the University Bureau of Mines.

The new appointments are Mr. E. K. Goettel, B. S. from the University of Illinois, Mr. V. A. Gleason, from the University of Washington and Mr. J. D. Arozana, from the University of Arizona all as assistants.

Mr. Goettel will be in particular charge of the investigation of rare metals, their occurrence, uses and marketing applying himself particularly to the Arizona problems.

Mr. Gleason is a specialist in flotation and ore dressing and will apply himself to Arizona problems of concentration and the dry placer investigations.

Mr. Arozana will be in charge of the assaying, mineralogical determinations, ore testing, etc.

With the above organizations the first year of the State Bureau of Mines should show good results.

Notice of Mohave County Union High School Bond Election.

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter Nine and Thirteen of Title Eleven of the Revised Statutes of Arizona (Civil Code) of 1913, notice is hereby given by the Board of Education of Mohave County Union High School District of Mohave County, Arizona, that an election has been called by said Board to be held, and that the same will be held in the Union High School district of Mohave County, Arizona, on Tuesday the 27th day of July, 1915, for the purpose of deciding whether the negotiable coupon bonds of said district shall be issued and sold by said district for the purpose of securing money, to-wit: Sixty Thousand Dollars for the building and erection of a County Union High School building in and for said district, and supplying the same with necessary and proper furniture and apparatus, and improving the grounds and site for same.

The bonds proposed to be issued shall consist of sixty (60) bonds of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) each, and shall be numbered from one to sixty inclusive. The whole of said bonds shall run and all shall become due and payable twenty (20) years from the date of their issuance, the said County Union High School District reserving the right to redeem the whole or any portion of said bonds at any time after ten years from the date thereof. The principal of said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum payable semi annually.

The polls of said election will be opened at the hour of six o'clock a. m. and closed at the hour of six o'clock p. m. during which period said polls will be continuously open for the reception of votes.

The said above named question, viz: "Shall the negotiable coupon bonds of Mohave County Union High School District, Mohave County, Arizona, be issued and sold by said District for the purpose of securing money, viz: Sixty Thousand Dollars, for the building and erecting of a County Union High School Building in and for said District, and supplying same with necessary and proper furniture and apparatus, and improving the grounds and site for same. Such bonds to consist of sixty bonds of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars each, and to be numbered from one to sixty inclusive. The whole of said bonds to run and the principal of each and all thereof to become due and payable absolutely twenty years from the date thereof, the said District reserving the right to redeem the whole or any of said bonds at any time after ten years from the date thereof. The principal of said bonds and each thereof to bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually," is hereby submitted for decision at said election to be held as aforesaid, at the time and places aforesaid, to such of the bona fide tax payers of the said Mohave County Union High School District, (and only such persons may vote at said election as have paid in their own name a county or State tax upon property situated within such district, other than poll, road or school tax, during the preceding year) who are in all other respects qualified electors for the purpose of voting at regular school elections, of which said bona fide taxpayers will please take notice.

The form and words of the ballots shall be "Bonds Yes" and "Bonds No". Those desiring to vote in the affirmative on said question should vote "Bonds Yes" and those desiring to vote in the negative should vote "Bonds No".
