SLOPE PAVING IN NORTH SHORE CHANNEL TO CONTRACTORS.

Sealed proposals indorsed "PROPOSALS FOR SLOPE PAVING IN NORTH SHORE CHANNEL" will be received by the Clerk of the Sanitary District of Chicago, Room 700, 900 South Michigan avenue, Chicago, Illinois, until 12:00 m., standard time, on November 6th, 1913, and will be publicly opened by the Board of Trustees at a meeting to be held on that date, or at the first meeting thereafter.

The work for which said tenders are invited consists of the construction of pile and timber protections and the construction of riprap slope paving at designated places in North Shore Channel, all situated in the City of Evanston and Village of Wilmette, in the county of Cook and state of Illinois.

The approximate quantities to be used in the comparison of proposals are:

- A. 3,500 square yards of RIP-RAP SLOPES.
- B. 40,000 lineal feet of PILES.
- C. 100,000 feet B. M. of TIMBER.

The proposals must be on blank forms of proposal furnished by the Sanitary District and shall be made in accordance with and to conform to all the terms and conditions set forth in "Requirements for Bidding and Instruction to Bidders" attached thereto.

Plans, specifications and forms of proposal may be obtained at the office of the said District.
